



SQ Chy fired shots to ensure Natun's death

War crimes witness describes the killing

Nutan Chandra Singha was writhing in pain at his home in Kundeshwari, Chittagong, as Salahuddin Quader Chowdhury "fired two or three rounds of bullets to ensure his death" on April 13, 1971 during the

Liberation War. Before that Nutan, founder of Kundeshwari

Oushadhalaya, was dragged out of a temple and the Pakistani army opened fire on him.

Gopal Chandra Das, former principal of Kundeshwari Girls' College, who witnessed the incident from the window of a first-floor room at Kundeshwari Complex, gave this vivid description in his deposition against war SEE PAGE 19 COL 1

TK 2,686-CRORE LOAN SCAM

ACC to sue 27 Sonali, Hall-Mark officials

The Anti-Corruption Commission is set to sue 27 senior officials of the Hall-Mark Group and Sonali Bank today for the Tk 2,686-crore loan scam.

Eleven cases would be filed against six Hall-Mark officials, including its Managing Director Tanvir Mahmud and Chairman

Jesmine Islam, and 21 officials of the staterun bank, including AKM Azizur Rahman, a former manager of its Rupashi Bangla

Hotel branch, said Mohammad Shahabuddin, commissioner of the anti-graft body.

The charges include misappropriation, forgery, money laundering, cheating and breach of trust, he told The Daily Star.

A six-member enquiry team led by ACC Deputy Director Mir Mohammad Zainul Abedin Shibli yester-

day submitted a report on the loan scam. SEE PAGE 6 COL 4

CRISL has rated Agrani Bank Limited (ABL) from two distinct perspectives, first, as a Highly Integrated Government Support Entity (GSE) and second, as a comercial bank on standalone basis i.e. without considering the Government support and on the basis of its actual position as a commercial bank. As a highly integrated GSE, CRISL has reaffirmed 'AAA' (triple A) rating in the Long Term and 'ST-1' in the Short Term to Agrani Bank Limited. The above ratings have been assigned in cosideration of implied commitment of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh to the bank for providing required support in distressed situation. In addition, the Government has also been utilizing the services of the bank in many commercial and government purposes through guarantee. Government has also been extending its support through policy and others to handle any adverse situation which is also a key consideration for the above ratings. In CRISL's opinion, the likelihood of Government support withdrawal to the bank is underpinned by the high economic cost of the bank's default. Hence, CRISL believes that the Government would do its utmost to maintain confidence in the banking system at any stressed position.

Banks rated in this category are adjudged to be of best quality, offer highest safety and have highest credit quality. Risk factors are negligible and risk free, nearest to risk free Government bonds and securities. Changing economic circumstances are unlikely to have any serious impact on this category of banks. The short-term rating indicates highest certainty of timely payment. Short-term liquidity including internal fund generation is very strong and access to alternative sources of funds is outstanding. Safety is almost like risk free Government short-term obligations.

As a stand-alone commercial bank CRISL has reaffirmed the rating of ABL to 'A+' (Pronounced as single A plus) in the Long Term and 'ST-2' in the Short Term. The above rating has been reassigned due to consistent maintenance of its fundamentals such as improvement in financial and operating performance, wide network of brances, considerably low cost of fund, investment in diversified sectors etc. However, the above factors were moderated, to some extent, by its high NPL with moderate NPL coverage, investment concentration to fewer loan accounts, CAR being sensitive to increase in NPL etc.

The long term rating implies that Banks rated in this category are adjudged to offer adequate safety for timely repayment of financial obligations. This level of rating indicates a corporate entity with an adequate credit profile. Risk factors are more variable and greater in periods of economic stress than those rated in the higher categories. Short-term rating indicates high certainty of timely payment. Liquidity factors are strong and supported by good fundamental protection factors. Risk factors are very small.

CRISL also viewed the bank with "Stable Outlook" in consideration of the fact that the existing fundamentals may continue in the foreseeable future.


