Current nets, hilsa seized

Members of Bangladesh Coastguard in an overnight seized at least 3,20,000 metres of fishing net and 80kg of mother hilsa in the district yesterday. A team led by Lieutenant Jahirul Haque conducted a drive in the area and seized the nets and fishes. Later, the fishes were distributed among the orphan and poor people.

Two commit 'suicide'

A woman and a madrasa girl allegedly committed suicide in Sadullapur and Sunderganj upazilas yesterday and the day before. Munni Akhter, 13, a class seven student at Madhupara Dakhil Madrasa in Sadullapur took pesticide yesterday. She was rushed to the upazila health complex where the doctors declared her dead. The reason behind the suicide could not be known immediately, said family sources. Feroja Begum, 42, of Bekatari village in Sunderganj, killed herself by taking poison following an alteration between her and her husband over a piece of disputed land on Tuesday midnight, said family members.

Bomb making materials seized

UNB, Benapole, Jessore

Police recovered huge quantity of bomb making materials at Dhopadi village in Abhoinagar upazila on Tuesday night. On secret information, a team raided Rupsha Poultry Farm, which was closed earlier, and recovered the materials in an abandoned condition. The materials include half kg of gun powder, sticks of nets, iron sheets, marbles, small boxes of tin and little balls of iron. However, none was arrested. Police said the criminals might use the spot for making bombs to carry out subversive activities.

Alleged rapist arrested

Police arrested a man on charge of violating two sisters at Baldi village in Dakhin Surma upazila on Tuesday. The arrested is Tara Mia, 50, of the village. Ahmed Nasir Uddin, officer in-charge of Dakhin Surma Police Station, said Tara raped the sisters, aged about seven to six, on September 27. The victims were tenants at the house of elder brother of the rapist. The girls were admitted to Sylhet Osmani Medical College and Hospital in critical condition.

Cattle trader found dead

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) recovered the body of a cattle trader from Monohorpur area in Shibganj upazila yesterday morning. The deceased was identified as Dulal Hossain, 19, son of Azahar Ali of Hasanpur village. Locals found his body in the river Padma in the border area and informed BGB men. Sub-inspector Dulal Uddin of Shibganj Police Station said Dulal went out of home on Sunday and since then he remained missing.

Date expired pesticides seized

A mobile court yesterday seized huge date expired pesticides at Hatkhola Road in the city. The pesticides include Thaigen, Compodin, Colodin and Basudev. Led by Sadar Upazila Nirbahi Officer Raja Mia, also the executive magistrate, the mobile court raided Orion Traders, seized the pesticides and fined the shop owner Ashfaquddin Tk 20,000.

Padma devours 92 houses in Ishwardi

The Padma devoured 92 houses, a mosque and a Shaheed Miner of Shara union in Ishwardi upazila in the last 10 days.

Md Shahidul Islam, secretary of Shara union parishad said Arambaria, Gopalpur, Shekherchar and Majhdiai villages of the union were hit by river erosion this year.

"Padma devoured 73 houses at Arambaria village while a mosque and a portion of a school went in the river in the last 10 days. In Gopalpur village, 11 houses, in Shekherchar four houses and in Majhdiai village 4 more houses were devoured," Shahidul said.

The mighty river also washed away 200 acres of

cropland in these four villages, he said, adding that over 200 houses and 500 acres of land are facing the threat of erosion.

While visiting the area, Md Jarjis Hossain, chairman of Shara union parishad told this correspondent that the river devoured 392 houses, two mosques, two temples, an eidgah, one graveyard, two orchards, 450 acres of cultivable lands in 6 villages of the union last year.

"The Padma is now eroding seven kilometre area of Shara union due to lack of any protection. Although we have submitted several applications to the higher authorities for a permanent step but to no effect yet," the chairman said.

Md Abdul Mabud Sheikh, sub-divisional engineer (SDE) of Water Development

Board (WDB), Pabna however said they took an urgent step to protect Shara union on September 28.

"We have started dumping sand bags in the affected areas. Although we have brought 10 thousand sand bags here to start the work but we need at least 1.23 lakh sand bags to complete the 700 meter protection work," he said.

We have also submitted a proposal for sanctioning Tk 5.28 crore to complete the work, he added.

But the locals see the protection work as almost meaningless as it was too poor an effort in the face of rapid erosion.

"If we want to save Shara union from Padma we need permanent protection using CC blocks", chairman Jarjis Hossain said.

Six get life for murder in Dinajpur

A Dinajpur court yesterday sentenced six people to life imprisonment for killing a man in 2006.

The convicts are Sumon, Syamol and Sabuj, sons of Mazammel Hossain of Bhatpara village, Kajal, son of Ahsan of Dinajpur Satellite town, Biplob, son of Idris Ali of Khalpara Municipality, and Abdur Razzak Ratan, son of Abdus Sobhan of Dakhin Balubari under Dinajpur Sadar upazila.

The court also fined them Tk 5,000 each, in default they are to suffer another year in jail. Judge Golam Ahamed Khalilur Rahman of the Special Judge's Court, Dinajpur, pronounced the verdict in the afternoon.

According to the prosecution, Shah Alam Babu, 35, of Power house area in the town was murdered in front of Dinajpur Medical College and Hospital on September 7 in 2006.

His father filed a case with Dinajpur Sadar Police Station the same day accusing eight people. After investigation, police pressed charges against eight people.

The court also acquitted two others as charges brought against them could not be proved.

In Sylhet, a court here on Tuesday sentenced a man to life imprisonment for killing his daughter eight years ago.

The convict is Layek Ahmed, 45, of Khojarkhola village under South Surma upazila. The court also fined him Tk 10,000, in default he is suffer one year more in jail, reports UNB.

According to the prosecu-

tion, Layek threw his four-year old daughter, Lima Akther into the Surma River following an altercation with his wife Nasima Begum on July 22, 2004. The body was found floating near Mistri Masjid the following day.

Jylhet divisional Special Judge Sufia Begum handed down the verdict.
