Erosion threatens Mawa terminal, parking yard

Erosion by the river Padma has taken an alarming turn in Louhajong upazila of Munshiganj, putting the newly built Mawa launch terminal and parking yard on the verge of collapse

Badiul Alam, assistant port officer at Mawa, said at least 25 to 30 feet area in the western part of the parking yard has developed cracks and may collapse anytime.

"We have kept speedboats in a line and are dumping sand bags at that point to protect the parking yard temporarily from onslaught of the river." he said.

It is widely alleged that mindless sand lifting from the river has triggered serious erosion in the area.

At least six business establishments adjacent to the launch terminal and parking yard went into the river and 10 others were shifted to other places yesterday morning.

Contacted, Louhajong Upazila Nirbahi Officer Md Saiful Islam said he informed the authorities concerned of the matter and urged them to take necessary steps to protect the terminal and parking yard.

The terminal and parking yard were built at a cost of Tk one crore and Shipping Minister Shahjahan Khan formally opened the both in May this year.

Golam Mortuza, officer in-charge (OC) of Sadar model police station, said a group of Shibir activists brought out a procession from Octroy intersection at around 12:15 pm and started obstructing the vehicular movement and vandalising vehicles.

On information, a police patrol team rushed to the

spot and tried to stop the procession. At this, the Shibir men attacked the law enforcers with brickbats, forcing them to fire two tear gas shells and charge baton,

Transport strike in SW dists from Oct 9

Transport workers yesterday announced an indefinite strike in the 21 districts of south-western region from October 9, protesting extortion on highways and demanding ban on plying of illegal bikes.

Bangladesh Sarak
Paribahan Sramik
Federation, Khulna divisional unit, announced the
strike at a press conference
held at Jessore Press Club in
the evening.

General secretary of the organisation Abdur Rahim Bux Dudu, said the transport workers are widely extorted and repressed by the local criminals at Daulatdia, Paturia, Maowa ferry terminals and Dhamrai in Manikganj.

We informed the local police stations several times but they did not pay heed to our plea, he said.

Moreover, police harassment also increased, leaving us with no alternative to calling strike from October 9, Dudu added.

The organisation placed a 11-point demand including end to vandalism and setting vehicles on fire, punishment to those responsible for road accidents, ban on plying of Nasimon, Karimon, Alamsadhu and other locally made vehicles on highways and withdrawal of cases against the transport owners and workers.

Sadiq Ahmad Khan, acting president, Emdadur Rahman, vice-president of the federation and leaders of Jessore, Meherpur, Magura, Jhenidah and Chuadanga transport unions were present at the press conference.

World Teachers Day being observed today holds very little meaning to Fateha Nurani, a teacher of AN Sammiloni Girls' High School in the town, as she has not got any salary even after 15 years of service at the institution.

Fateha, who joined as an assistant teacher for the senior section (classes IX and X) of the school at Niznanduali village under Magura municipality in 1997, is still outside the payroll as the section has remained outside the government's monthly payment order (MPO).

"Now I feel embarrassed to introduce myself as a teacher as I have not got any salary during my 15 years' service. But I cannot resist the urge to attend classes when the school bell rings. The school is adjacent to my house and I have developed a deep passion for teaching," Fateha told this correspondent on Wednesday.

AN Sammiloni Girls' High School was

established in 1995 and subsequently its junior section (classes VI to VIII) was listed for MPO.

The school has now over three hundred students but its senior section has remained outside the MPO although 14 schools and madrasas in four upazilas of the district got MPO in the financial year 2009-10.

Besides Fateha, two other teachers of the school -- Khan Rakibul Haque and Beloara Khanam are also in the same boat for the last 14 years.

When asked, District Education Officer Ruhul Amin Khondoker said, "The ministry concerned is the lone authority to sanction MPO on the basis of local lawmaker's recommendation."

Contacted over cell phone, lawmaker of Magura-1 constituency Prof Mohammad Serajul Akbar said, "I had given demand order (D/O) letter for the MPO listing of the senior section of AN Samilony Girls High School, but the D/O was not honoured by the ministry. Earlier the junior section of the school got MPO following my recommendation."

Rizia Begum, headmistress of the school, said, "In spite of her financial deprivation, Fateha always teaches the students with a smiling face, giving an impression of a dedicated teacher. But I have nothing to do regarding her salary as the senior section is still struggling to get MPO."
