

# Chelsea march on

Chelsea extended their lead at the top of the Premier League to four points with a 4-1 win against Norwich, while Manchester City got back on track after their recent struggles as the champions crushed Sunderland 3-0 on Saturday.

Roberto Di Matteo's unbeaten Chelsea have made a flying start to their title challenge and this was the Europeans champions' sixth win in seven league matches.

The Blues recovered from the shock of Norwich striker Grant Holt's 11th minute opener at Stamford Bridge to take complete control before half-time.

Fernando Torres equalised with his fifth goal of the season when the Spaniard headed home from a Branislav Ivanovic cross in the 14th minute.

Frank Lampard put Chelsea in front in the 22nd minute with a drive from the edge of the area and Belgian playmaker Eden Hazard, netting a cool 31st minute strike from Juan Mata's pass, shattered Norwich's resistance.

Ivanovic rubbed salt into Norwich's wounds when he bagged the fourth goal with 14 minutes left.

Roberto Mancini's City spluttered through the start of their title defence and assault on the Champions League, but a convincing display at Eastlands secured a second victory in their last seven fixtures in all competitions and their first cleansheet of the season at the 10th attempt.

The hosts were ahead after five minutes

when Serbian defender Aleksandar Kolarov curled a superb free-kick past Sunderland goalkeeper Simon Mignolet.

Argentine substitute Sergio Aguero got the second goal on the hour when he steered in a Kolarov cross from close-range for his first goal at Eastlands since the dramatic strike that won the title on the final day of last season.

And England midfielder James Milner ensured City would move into second place with an 89th minute free-kick that glanced in off Sunderland's Craig Gardner.

Third-placed Everton salvaged a 2-2 draw at Wigan thanks to a late penalty from Leighton Baines.

Wigan went ahead in controversial circumstances when Arouna Kone finished off a fine run from Shaun Maloney even though the Ivory Coast striker was clearly offside.

Everton hit back one minute later through Nikica Jelavic, the Croatia forward heading home for his 13th goal in 16 league starts.

The Latics regained the lead through Franco Di Santo in the 23rd minute, but England left-back Baines fired home from the spot following Maynor Figueroa's foul on Kevin Mirallas with three minutes to go.

West Bromwich Albion continued their surprising start to the season as the Baggies climbed to fourth place with a 3-2 victory over bottom of the table QPR at the Hawthorns.

Steve Clarke's team took the lead after just five minutes when Scotland midfielder James Morrison fired into the bottom corner and the hosts increased their advantage through Zoltan Gera in the 22nd minute.

## Focus is back

Real Madrid's players are over their early season malaise and have regained their focus coach Jose Mourinho said on Saturday ahead of the team's trip to play La Liga leaders Barcelona.

The champions head off to the Nou Camp on Sunday eight points adrift of their arch-rivals after a wobbly start to the league campaign in which they have lost twice, the same number of games they lost over the whole of last season.

"I have confidence in my players, as always," Mourinho told a news conference.

"When they work hard obviously I have more confidence in them, complete confidence."

Mourinho was highly critical of the attitude of his players after their defeats at Getafe and Sevilla, but they have responded since then winning four matches on the trot in all competitions, netting 14 goals.

"I think you can see the players have understood they had to change," he said.

"They understood they had to be more motivated, to be more focused and that the way the team was, would have led to a negative end to the season.

"It's a credit to them. They have changed, and in this way it is easier for good things to happen."

There have been a steady stream of media stories about rifts within the dressing room over the last month, with time on the substitutes' bench for Spain defender Sergio Ramos and Germany midfielder Mesut Ozil being reported as some kind of 'punishment'.

In response, Mourinho said the decisions were all part of the normal routine of a team.

"There is no need for drama when a player is on the bench," he said. "There are 24 in the squad so that means there are 13 who don't play, and every time there is someone on the bench there is a furor.

"I am paid to decide on the lineups, I try to do it to the best of my abilities. Full stop."

## Falcao eyes EPL move

Atletico Madrid striker Radamel Falcao has revealed he is keen to follow in the footsteps of his idol Faustino Asprilla by moving to the Premier League.

Falcao has been linked with several Premier League clubs including Chelsea and it has been reported that the Colombia international could move to Stamford Bridge in a £45 million deal during the January transfer window.

The 26-year-old, who underlined his talent with a hatrick against Chelsea in the European Super Cup earlier this season, admits a switch to the Premier League would appeal to him because he grew up watching fellow Colombian Asprilla in action for Newcastle during the 1990s.

"England? One day, I could go. It is a game I have watched for a long time and one day I would like to sample it," Falcao told The Times.

"I used to watch it on television when I was a kid. Players like Roy Keane, Eric Cantona, (Gianfranco) Zola. But the one I supported was (Faustino) Asprilla, when he was at Newcastle.

"I think I could adapt to England. I think I could score goals."

## Conte ban slashed

Juventus coach Antonio Conte has had his 'Calcioscommesse' match-fixing ban reduced from 10 months to four months, Italy's National Court of Arbitration for Sport (TNAS) announced on Friday.

Conte was suspended by the Italian authorities before the start of the season after being accused of failing to disclose knowledge of match-fixing during his time at Siena in the 2010-11 season.

He will now be able to resume his position on the touchline with the Turin giants, level with Napoli at the top of Serie A, on December 8.

Conte's ban has been endorsed by football's world ruling body FIFA, meaning he cannot coach the Serie A champions during international as well as domestic fixtures.

His punishment was shortened following a meeting on Tuesday when his lawyers submitted fresh evidence to arbitrators.

Conte has always denied the charge that he was aware that the match between his then team Sienna and Albinoleffe on May 29, 2011, was fixed.

In a statement TNAS declared that it "rejects Antonio Conte's main demand (of his innocence) but partially accepts it and now inflicts this punishment on him until December 8."

Conte can resume his place in the Juve dugout for the Serie A game against Palermo.

But he will have to wait until the Champions League knockout stages should Juventus make it that far as the concluding group stage match is held on December 5, three days before his ban expires.

Juventus president Andrea Agnelli welcomed the decision.

"I maintain my view, which is shared by everyone at Juventus, that Antonio Conte is an innocent man and in no way guilty of the charges levelled at him," said Agnelli.

"The confirmation of his suspension is an injustice which should prompt the entire footballing system to ask itself questions."

## Jol angry at Zamora

Fulham manager Martin Jol has accused his former striker Bobby Zamora of "sour grapes" after the England international claimed the majority of the club's players didn't like the Dutchman.

Zamora quit Fulham to join west London rivals QPR in January after reports that the forward had clashed with Jol on several occasions.

The 31-year-old this week said he was not the only Fulham star to have a problem with Jol and insisted that was the reason several senior players had left Craven Cottage since the end of last season.

Mousa Dembele, Clint Dempsey, Danny Murphy, Andrew Johnson and Dickson Etuhu have all departed in recent months, but Jol insisted Zamora's bitter blast meant nothing to him.

"It is probably sour grapes," Jol said on Friday. "I think nothing is what it seems. Everyone knows me. The players know me so one player will say this, another player will say that."

"It doesn't matter. I don't care. For me, the most important thing is we get the results so you will have to ask the players. "If they do well and work hard, I try to

get a good relationship with them. If not, I don't."

"Insiders here know that this probably started after two weeks of me being here."

"There was a few leaks in the paper and I asked him and he said 'no, it wasn't me'. I knew it was him and his agent 100 per cent."

"He said 'no, it wasn't me, I hate the press'. He hated defence and later said he hated crosses as well and that was the moment I thought 'maybe it is better to sell' and that is what we did."

Former Tottenham boss Jol was also keen to play down Zamora's suggestion that he wasn't able to get players to warm to him.

"If you take Clint Dempsey, it is different from Mousa Dembele," Jol added.

"Mousa was phoning me after his move (to Tottenham) and thanking me for everything. Every player is different."

"Clint wanted to move so then the relationship would not be great. Danny Murphy I wanted to keep so ask him. There were no issues at all."

"With Bobby it started after a couple of weeks. Everybody knew and now he has moved on."

"I don't think it is typically English to make comments after a year or eight months."

## Sevilla lose again

Sevilla slumped to their second consecutive defeat with a 2-0 reverse at promoted Celta Vigo on Friday, putting the breaks on their strong start to the La Liga season.

Michel's side won plaudits for their battling 1-0 home victory over champions Real Madrid last month, and for pushing leaders Barcelona all the way only to lose 3-2 in stoppage time last weekend.

At a noisy Balaidos, however, they conceded a penalty when a freekick hit Hedwiges Maduro on the arm in the wall after an hour, and local favourite Iago Aspas netted from the spot.

As the visitors pushed up in search of an equaliser Enrique De Lucas glanced home a header in the 85th minute to secure Celta's third victory on their return to the top-flight.

Sevilla are fifth with 11 points from seven games, one point and one place ahead of Real Madrid.

Champions Real visit the Nou Camp on Sunday to play arch-rivals Barca, who top the standings with a perfect 18 points from six games.

## Borowka reveals alcohol problems

Former Germany international Uli Borowka, a recovering alcoholic, has revealed current Bundesliga stars with a similar problem have approached him for advice.

Borowka, 50, has written a book -- "Flat Out" -- describing his battle with alcohol at the end of his career having played for Borussia Moenchengladbach and Werder Bremen in the 1980s and 1990s.

The ex-defender says there are currently players in the Bundesliga with a similar problem.

Having not drunk alcohol since 2000, Borowka, who won six caps for West Germany in 1988 and played at Euro '88, says Bundesliga players have approached him to ask for advice.

"Of course there are! I can not give a number, but the grey area is very large," he told German daily Bild when asked if there are current Bundesliga players struggling with alcohol problems.

"Besides alcohol, there are other problems. Drugs and other addictions."

"I will never name names, but when I told my story for the first time, many professional footballer contacted me."

"Some wanted advice from me, as they didn't know who else they could turn to."

"I am planning to found an organisation to which professionals can turn to with their problems. In four weeks it should be ready."

But Borowka was clear that players should not go public in admitting their problems.

"Not in this life! Whether they are an alcoholic, suffer with burnout or are gay," he said.

"They would be finished. As a professional athlete, you can't show weakness."

Borowka says at the height of his alcoholism he was drinking a crate of beer, a bottle of whiskey and various shots per day at the end of the 1990s.

"I would wake up in my own vomit in the morning, knock back the remains of the previous night and continue drinking," he said.

## Brandao lifts St Etienne

Brazilian footballer Brandao proved that his judicial woes are finally behind him with a first-half double which helped lift Saint Etienne to a 4-0 win against Nancy on Friday.

The 32-year-old Brandao was cleared in a rape case this week after the alleged victim opted not to appeal a decision that saw charges against him dismissed for lack of evidence.

The alleged incident occurred when Brandao was playing for Marseille in March 2011. He was later loaned to Brazilian clubs Cruzeiro and Gremio in a bid to avoid media scrutiny.

The striker returned to Marseille in January this year but last month signed a two-year deal with Ligue 1 rivals St Etienne.

And the Brazilian showed his form in the Stade Geoffroy-Guichard with his first goals of the season as he opened for the home side after nine minutes with a header into the net of Nancy goalkeeper Damien Gregorini.

Midfielder Romain Hamouma doubled the hosts' account after 18 minutes before Brandao added a second three minutes later, again with header this time off a Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang cross.

And Gabonese striker Aubameyang completed the scoreline after 25 minutes for just Saint Etienne's second win at home this season as they move up to seventh with 11 points from eight games.

Nancy remain second from bottom with just four points.
