RAILWAYGATE SCANDAL

It was not first time

Whistleblower claims to have carried money to Suranjit's house before; Suranjit bins it all

STAR REPORT

Driver Azam Khan, the whistleblower of the railwaygate scandal, claimed that he on one occasion had carried Tk 2 crore collected from railway jobseekers as bribe to Suranjit's house.

"We used to bring the money from Yusuf Ali Mridha's house. A few days ago [before the scandal surfaced] Mr Faruq asked him [Mridha] in the car how much money was there. He [Mridha] said, 'The full amount, two crore.' I was there. I later carried the money to a room inside Suranjit Babu's house," said Azam in the

conclusion of the two-part interview with Rtv. The second part was aired yesterday.

However, Suranjit Sengupta yesterday at a rally in his constituency Sunamganj claimed that he had never met Azam and that he had no link with the scandal. He was innocent and clean.

Azam was the driver of Suranjit Sengupta's sacked- assistant personal secretary (APS) Omar Faruq Talukder.

In the interview Azam also claimed that the bribe money from jobseekers had been used in the telecom business of

Sources close to Ershad gave a different account of what was behind Reza's expulsion

They said the JP chairman in 2003 assigned Reza to look after his cold storage and other businesses in Rangpur and Dhaka.

"But recently he [Reza] misbehaved with sir [Ershad] when he sought to look into the

accounts of those businesses. Besides, sir was displeased with his misappropriation of money," a JP leader, who is also a party presidium member, said wishing not to be named.

The Happy Planet Index 2012 has ranked Bangladesh 11th among 151 countries, ahead of both India and Pakistan, which ranked 32nd and 16th respectively.

The Happy Planet Index is calculated using life expectancy, well-being and ecological footprint of the countries with data collected from various sources including UNDP and Gallup.

The index was introduced in July 2006 by a British NGO, the New Economics Foundation, which also has a branch in the US.

The HPI 2012 ranked Costa Rica as the happiest country in the world,

Fake note den busted, 4 held

Detectives yesterday arrested four members of a ring counterfeiting bank bills, seized notes worth Tk 24 lakh and busted their mini-factory in the capital's Uttara.

The detainees are Mominur Rashid Babu alias Driver Babu, 25, Mohammad Rubel alias Chashma Rubel, 28, Mohammad Shaheen Miah, 24, and Khokan Miah, 26. The factory at a flat on the third

floor of house no-197 near Jamtola Mosque at East Azampur under Dakkhinkhan Police Station was busted in a drive by detective personnel around 4:00pm, Mashiur Rahman, additional deputy commissioner (ADC) of Detective Branch (West), told The Daily Star.

The law enforcers confiscated fake notes of Tk 1000 and Tk 500. They also seized huge quantity of specialised papers, inks, gums, a
