

Stop polluting Dhaka rivers

Task force gives 2-month time to plug sewage lines

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The Inter-ministerial Task Force on rivers has served on the capital's house owners a two-month ultimatum to stop discharging excreta into the river and to make their own septic tanks.

At present a large number of house owners link their sewage lines with the storm sewerage system, making the rivers around the capital flow with wastes.

In a bid to make the capital's rivers pollution free, the taskforce earlier formed a committee to identify the major sources of the ongoing pollution.

"We have set a two-month time period to stop discharge of sewage into the rivers. Following this, the

58pc children still need basic services

13 percent engaged in child labour

Bangladesh made significant progress in promoting child rights during the last five years but around 58 percent children are still deprived of one of six basic services, says a government draft report.

The draft of the Fifth Periodic Report on child rights labels shelter, sanitation, water, information, education and health as the six basic services for children.

The report--revealed at a consultation

meeting yesterday--also states that around 13 percent of all children between the age five and 14 years were still engaged in child labour.

Capacity Building for Monitoring Child Rights, of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, organised the meeting with stakeholders at the city's Biam Auditorium to finalise the report.

The report is to be submitted to the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child by




