# Attack on Vadra is attack on party

Congress gets tough on the issue

The India's ruling Congress party on Monday stood firm behind Sonia Gandhi's son-in-law Robert Vadra saying any attack on him is an attack on the party itself.

"The attack is part of a well-planned conspiracy not against an individual but against the Congress and its leadership," party spokesperson Rashid Alvi said in answer to a question.

Simultaneously, Finance Minister P Chidambaram ruled out any investigation into Vadra's business dealings: unless there was a specific allegation of quid pro quo or corruption.

Two of Congress' allies also came to its rescue. Union Agriculture Minister and NCP boss Sharad Pawar dared India Against Corruption activist Arvind Kejriwal to go to court if he could substantiate his allegations; Rashtriya Janata Dal supremo Lalu Prasad accused the latter of targeting Vadra "to get cheap publicity."

Even BJP seemed unwilling to capitalise on the Vadra saga. On Saturday, its president Nitin Gadkari had told CNN-IBN in an interview: "I have no paperwork. I kept hearing about it but I had no evidence. I can't accuse anyone of anything without evidence, can I?" Leader of the Opposition Sushma Swaraj, too, refrained from comment on her Twitter account.

### Egypt pardons 'revolutionaries'

# Experts, Obama camp pan Romney

Mitt Romney's foreign policy speech Monday was filled with tough talk and slams of President Barack Obama's leadership but little of the clarity Romney has vowed to bring to the Oval Office, experts say.

Analysts reviewing what the Republican nominee said in what his campaign billed as a major foreign policy address weren't impressed.

Team Obama blasted Mitt Romney's foreign policy speech, saying it was full of "heated rhetoric" and "chestthumping" but few specifics.

"This is Mitt Romney's seventh attempt, by our count, to reboot his foreign policy," campaign spokeswoman Jen Psaki told reporters aboard Air Force One. "When you're commander in chief, you don't get to bring an Etch a Sketch into the Oval Office. You don't get second chances, never mind seven chances.

She also said it's "striking" that Romney didn't speak a lot about about China, and she said Romney needs to

be more clear about what the differences are between his approach and the president's in places like Syria.

"What exactly are they suggesting we do? What exactly is their plan and their proposal? So if they're going further, they should say that," she said.

Experts say, Romney's speech also seemed to reflect a divide in Republican circles between foreign policy experts who have aggressively promoted democracy as a way to advance American goals in the Middle East and others who believe the Arab Spring movement threatens to unleash forces that could be more hostile to the United States and to Israel than the authoritarian regimes.

## Romney catches up Obama

Mitt Romney got a poll boost from his strong debate performance against President Barack Obama but it is too early to know how significant or lasting the bounce for the Republican challenger will be.

Three days after the debate, the two candidates were tied at 47 percent. Obama had 5 points points lead before the debate. Obama still had a three-

point edge, 49 to 46 percent, in Gallup's seven-day rolling average ending Saturday, which included polls before and after the debate. A separate national poll by

the Pew Research Center conducted in the days after the debate showed Romney backed by 49 percent of likely voters and Obama with the support of 45 percent.


