

3rd D8 Meeting fosters expectations in trade and industry for Bangladesh.

The Developing Eight (D8) nations are a group of developing nations, predominantly Muslim, that have come together for mutual support in economic development. The D8 was created during a summit of the member Heads of Government and State on 15 June 1997, in Istanbul, Turkey. Members include: Bangladesh, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan, and Turkey. This group represents 60 percent of the world's Muslim population and 13 percent of all people everywhere.

Today, the D8 concentrates its efforts on trade and commerce issues. With increasing influence in international affairs, its aim is to enhance member socioeconomic development through economic cooperation and innovation in industrialisation to support trade.

The first D8 Meeting of Ministers of Industry, in Tehran in 2010, was followed by a second meeting in Istanbul the following year. Dhaka was selected as the site of the 2012 meeting and this third D8 Meeting of the Ministers of Industry will be held in Dhaka on 10 October 2012. It follows two days (8 and 9 October 2012) of the 7th Meeting of the D8 Working Group on Industrial Cooperation.

These meetings are designed to create opportunities for discussion between the governments of the member states and private sector organisations seeking to enhance trade between nations. D8 trade with the rest of the world stands at \$400 billion, but is only \$60 billion between member nations. As a result, twelve taskforces, created during previous meetings, will concentrate on inter-member trade in automotive, cement, steel, electronic, petrochemical, energy, food, textile, standardization, conformity assessment, accreditation and metrology, small and medium enterprises, machinery, and technology sectors.

This third meeting may result in the inclusion of a taskforce for pharmaceutics, an important fast-growing, sector to Bangladesh. It is also expected that entrepreneurs from all member states will participate with a view to establishing high tech joint ventures in Bangladesh.

To help facilitate these entrepreneurial activities, the following are also participating in this series of meetings and international efforts: the Federation of Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce & Industry (FBCCI); the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce & Industry (MCCI); the Dhaka Chamber of Commerce & Industry (DCCI), and the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC).

Taskforce meetings are inclusive of representation from government, industry, non-government organisations, and educational institutions. Papers presented on specific topics will highlight the opportunities available to further cooperation and generate trade. Some of the topics of these taskforce meetings will highlight efforts in commerce, finance, privatization, human resource development, science and technology, national quality infrastructure, elimination of poverty, health and tourism.

Sheikh Hasina, the Honourable Prime Minister of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh will inaugurate these meetings in her capacity as Chief Guest on 10 October 2012. The Working Group meetings was inaugurated by Mr. Dilip Barua, Minister of Industry on 8 October 2012.

Concurrent seminars are being hosted by DCCI on small and medium enterprises, Bangladesh Pharmaceuticals Association on pharmaceutics, and Bangladesh Textile Mills Association & Garments Manufacturing Exporters Association (jointly) on textiles and garments. Delegates are expected to tour local industrial and pharmaceutical facilities where discussions may further enhance exposure of Bangladesh capability to the other member states.

The media centre, established for the meetings, oversees a website (www.d8dhaka.gov.bd) and distributes information kits and souvenirs. Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy will perform a colourful cultural programme celebrating the various traditions of D8 member states. There will also be an exhibition for promotion of Bangladesh exportable goods and services.

It is expected that this demonstration of mutual cooperation and transfer of technology between members will facilitate faster growth in local and international enterprise and industries, aimed at attaining "Green Industry." All G8 member states would benefit from such an initiative.

Message

It is an honor and pleasure for me, as the Secretary-General of the D-8 Organization for Economic Cooperation, to address this message to the 3rd Industry Ministerial Meeting in Dhaka, Bangladesh. I feel particular pleasure to witness that the Dhaka Meeting is going to take place a year after the successful holding of the Second Ministerial Meeting in October 2011 in Istanbul; such a regularity does indeed reflect the keen interest within the community in the collectice cooperation in the field of industry and augurs well for the future of this important component of our collective efforts.

The critical role of industry in the process of progress and development of socieites can hardly be over-emphasized; it is part and parcel of the accumulated historical experience, knowledge and wisdom of the human community, inclusive of the community of developing socieites to which we belong. We have come to appreciate, more and more, that industrialization proper -with growing emphasis across the developing South on Small and Medium Interprises (SMEs) -play a significant role in employment and income creation for substantial and even everincreasing segments of our societies.

Designation of industrial cooperation, with emphasis on SMEs, as one of the five Priority Areas in the 2008-2018 Roadmap and its active pursual ever since is clearly indicative of its pivotal significance for the objective of cooperation within the D-8 community.
