

Nadir claims innocence Cricket SPORTS REPORTER Bangladesh ICC panel umpire Nadir Shah, who has found himself at the centre of cricket's latest fixing controversy

following a sting operation by Indian television channel India TV in which he was shown to have been willing to give doctored decisions in lieu of money, refuted the allegation in various interviews yesterday. "These are baseless allegations. I am not paying it any heed," said Shah during a telephone interview with BBC Bangla while away on a personal trip to Kolkata. "The world

has listened to what they said (on the tape), but no one is listening to what I have to say. I listened to what they had to say, but when I realised that they were trying to fix matches I said that I will not do it." When asked whether he had informed the International Cricket Council (ICC) or the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB)

about his encounter, Shah replied that he had not because he did not think that things would be taken this far. "I did not let them (ICC and BCB) know because I did not think that things would go that far. My agent knew but told me to stay quiet. They (the India TV undercover reporters)

called me again, but I told them that I am unwilling to talk to them and urged them not to call me again." Shah, who has officiated in 40 one-day internationals and

three T20 internationals, also said that he is not much worried about the ICC investigation into the matter because he has not committed any crime, and stressed that he would tell the truth to the ICC investigation team.

Meanwhile, the BCB have pledged to launch an investigation of their own in which they will call all of the parties involved and look into the matter in detail. At the moment the BCB is trying to procure the video footage of the sting operation in its entirety so that it can conduct a detailed investigation that cuts to the heart of the matter. The ICC had already requested India TV to hand over the video footage.

danger, after the ICC almost agreed to change the structure of its administrative hierarchy in line with the Lord Woolf Report, which threatened to abolish the vicepresident's post for better governance. The BCB president though was always

optimistic about his chances. "There were never any obstacles in my way to this post. It was only a matter of time; there were just a number of processes that the ICC had to go through," said Kamal.

The wait has finally come to an end for Kamal, who in his bid to accomplish his mission, left no stones unturned. The highly critical step of attempting to send the Bangladesh cricket team for a tour in Pakistan, which, reportedly helped him win the nomination from the PCB, was just one of the risks that Kamal took in pursuit of what can only be described as his 'dream job'.

The road to the vice-president's post seemed more like a personal battle for Kamal, who actually managed to convince the PCB to nominate him for the post, much before the BCB officially submitted his name, in December last year.

Kamal, no doubt, had to go through a series of diplomatic negotiations with different cricketing boards to achieve what he has today. He has also handled the wrath of the media with grit and patience. However, only time can tell as to how beneficial Kamal's high profile position will be for the newest Test playing nation in the world.

A brace from winger Shohel Rana helped Mohammedan all but confirm their quarterfinal berth in the Grameenphone Federation Cup with a 3-0 win over Bangladesh Police at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

The ten-time Federation Cup champions now top Group A with two successive wins and just need a single point against star-studded Sheikh Russel KC in their last match to move into the last eight after two seasons. However, the Motijheelbased outfit will be through with a match in hand if Sheikh Russel can beat Bangladesh Police in today's match.

Title contenders Abahani started their Group C campaign on a winning note after beating Jessore DFA Ekadosh 2-0 under floodlights. Elsewhere, Brothers Union and Rahmatganj MFS played out a goalless draw at the Birshreshtha Shaheed

Mostafa Kamal Stadium in Kamalapur.

Riding on a 4-0 win over Rampur Boys Club of Feni in the previous match, Mohammedan posted their second successive victory but not before spending some torrid time against Bangladesh Police who put up an improved performance after being humiliated 5-0 by big-budgeted Sheikh Russel KC in their tournament opener.

Police goalkeeper Jafrul Islam initially denied the Black and Whites after thwarting two successive efforts by Maruf Ahmed and Wasio Olalekan.

Mohammedan came close to taking the lead in the 28th minute but a powerful shot from Maruf Ahmed went wide hitting the side-post. National winger Shohel Rana broke the deadlock just one minute later with a clinical side-volley inside the box after to judge a

It was again Shohel who doubled the lead with a clever over-head chip in the 69th minute while Shariful Islam sealed the match with a right-footed shot from the right-hand side of the box in the 74th minute and sent Bangladesh Police packing.

In the second match, Abahani got off to a winning start but the triumph was not convincing against a team outside the capital who played without their six players of starting eleven as six players are engaged in the Chittagong League.

It was understood that Jessore DFA was much happier despite the loss and they left the field satisfied as they held their illustrious opponents after conceding two in the second half half.

West Indies all-rounder Dwayne Bravo will not take part in the Champions League for Chennai Super Kings due to a thigh strain. He has been replaced by the Sri Lankan fast bowler Nuwan Kulasekara in the squad that is already in South Africa.

Super Kings have also lost batsman S Anirudha, who will be out of action for six weeks after fracturing his right clavicle during the Challenger Trophy in Rajkot. He has been replaced by the left-arm spinner Shadab Jakati.

Upul Tharanga, the Sri Lanka opening batsman, will be out of action for Uva Next due to a broken finger. He has been replaced by Ashan Priyanjan, the right-handed batsman, who led Sri Lanka in the 2008 Under-19 World Cup in Malaysia. Priyanjan didn't play in the Sri Lanka Premier League Twenty20 tournament held in August, which Uva won to qualify for the Champions League.
