French investigators probing the death of Yasser Arafat questioned his widow Suha, who claims the veteran Palestinian leader may have been poisoned, in France in mid-September, a source

told AFP yesterday. France opened a murder enquiry in late August after Arafat's family launched legal action following reports he may have died from radioactive polonium near Paris in 2004.

The source said Suha, a resident of Malta, had met with investigators in the Paris suburb of Nanterre, where the family's complaint was filed. No other details were disclosed.

French investigators are due to arrive on November 26 in Ramallah, where the former Palestinian leader is entombed.

Syria dismisses truce talk without rebels

The war is risk to region, says UN envoy

The Syrian government yesterday said the international envoy's call for a holiday ceasefire would likely fail because the rebels fighting to topple Bashar Assad's regime have no unified leadership to agree to it.

The envoy, Lakhdar Brahimi, had asked Iranian officials to help broker a truce during the Muslim holiday Eid al-Adha, which falls later this month.

But Syria's state-run Al-Thawra newspaper, a government mouthpiece,

said yesterday that the biggest obstacle to the truce was the lack of an authority to sign for the rebels.

"There is the state, represented by the government and the Army on one front, but who is on the other front," the paper asked in an editorial.

All international efforts to end Syria's civil war to date have failed. Both rebels and government forces have disregarded previous ceasefires, and the scores of rebel units

fighting to topple the regime have no unified leadership. Many don't communicate with each other.

Brahimi, the joint UN-Arab League envoy, arrived in Beirut yesterday for talks with Lebanese officials on how to resolve the crisis. The visit is part of a regional

Rebels downed a helicopter yesterday as troops fought to take back a key Syrian town,

a watchdog said, as international peace envoy Lakhdar Brahimi warned the conflict risks setting the region ablaze.

Fighting for control of the Damascus-Aleppo highway raged around the northwestern town of Maaret al-Numan even as Brahimi appeared to have won tentative support for a ceasefire proposal.

Meanwhile, Pope Benedict XVI has engaged the Catholic Church in pushing for peace in Syria by dispatching a high-profile delegation to a country where Christians are divided on support for the rebels.

Evidence of mass murder after Gaddafi's death: HRW

New evidence implicating militias in executions after ousted Libyan dictator Muammar Gaddafi was captured and killed in Sirte last October 20 raises fresh questions over his death, a watchdog said yesterday.

"The evidence suggests that opposition militias summarily executed at least 66 captured members of Kadhafi's convoy in Sirte," his home town, said Peter Bouckaert, emergencies director at Human Rights Watch (HRW).

"Our findings call into question the assertion by Libyan authorities that Moamer Kadhafi was killed in crossfire, and not after his capture," Bouckaert said of a Human Rights Watch report documenting the executions.

Mantel makes history with second Booker Prize

Mantel picked up the prize, one of the highest profile awards in English-language literature, for "Bring up the Bodies," part two of her Thomas Cromwell trilogy, at a ceremony at London's Guildhall.

The 60-year-old first won in 2009 with
