2 workers die from electrocution

Two welders died from electrocution at a workshop in the capital's Kadamtali yesterday.

Illegal water plants unearthed

DMP to bar hide-laden trucks' exit from capital

Police will not let trucks carrying hides of sacrificial animals go outside Dhaka from October 27, Eid day, to October 31 to prevent smuggling of the animal skins, said Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) Commissioner Benazir Ahmed yesterday.

He was addressing a press briefing in the capital's DMP Media Centre regarding DMP's security measures marking Durga Puja and Eid-ul-Azha.

Two police control rooms were set up to monitor law and order situation from October 14 to 31, when the religious festivals would take place, while a three-tier security measure

would be in place till October 29, he said.

Police will also take special security measures from tomorrow to October 24 for puja.

Police introduced additional patrol teams and installed closed circuit television cameras to keep an eye on 206 puja mandaps, 27 makeshift cattle markets, shopping malls, National Eidgah and Baitul Mukarram National Mosque, he said.

"Cops in plainclothes and additional police in uniform will be deployed on the spots," he said.

Temporary police camps will be set up at bus terminals, river ports and train stations while some counterfeit money detectors will be set up at cattle markets, he added.

WAGE FOR NEWSPAPERS, AGENCIES 50 percent dearness allowance declared

The government yesterday announced monthly 50 percent dearness allowance (DA) of the basic salary fixed under the 7th wage board for the journalists, employees and other staff of newspapers and news agencies. As per the section 146(1) of The Bangladesh Labour Act,

2006, the 8th Wage Board yesterday declared the dearness allowance for the interim period with effect from July 1 2012 ahead of announcement of the new wage board, said a handout.

The dearness allowance will be adjusted with the new salary structure to be fixed under the 8th Wage Board.

On June 18, the government formed the 8th Wage Board with retired Judge of the Supreme Court Justice Kazi Ebadul Haque as its chairman to recommend increased wages for the journalists, employees and press workers after reviewing the 7th Wage Board Award.

Snapped rail link restored

Two staff of derailed train suspended STAR REPORT

Rail communications between Dhaka and Chittagong, Sylhet, and Noakhali, which were suspended following derailment of a freight train, resumed after nine hours yesterday.

The train was derailed at Kasba of Brahmanbaria around 3:00am, for which the railway authorities had to cancel three pairs of trains scheduled for yesterday. The suspended trains,

Chattala Express and Mohanagar-Godhuli, run on Dhaka-Chittagong route and Paharika Express on Dhaka-Sylhet route. All the other trains on the

routes were also delayed by several hours, causing immense sufferings to thousands of passengers.

The rail service resumed by the afternoon as a salvage train managed to remove the derailed locomotive and two wagons from the railway tracks, reports our Brahmanbaria correspondent quoting a railway official who led the rescue operation.

Following a primary probe, the authorities suspended driver Shahjahan Mollah and his assistant Mahmud Ali of the derailed train for their negligence, reports our Chittagong correspondent quoting a top official of Bangladesh Railway.

On Wednesday, rail communications between Chittagong and other parts of the country remained disrupted for five hours after a train coach had derailed in

The top official said derailment of a train among 172 others running for the east zone is a normal matter.

FOREIGN FRIENDS IN 1971 61 to be honoured tomorrow

Bangladesh will confer awards on 61 more foreign friends tomorrow for their outstanding contributions to the country's Liberation War 41 years ago. President Zillur Rahman and Prime Minister Sheikh

Hasina will ceremonially hand over "Muktijuddho Moitri Sammanana" to them at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in the capital. The 61, most of them from India, are receiving the state

honour in the third phase. Earlier, Bangladesh's government honoured a number of foreign friends in July 2011 and March this year.

The foreign friends' support came when Bangalees stood up against the atrocities and genocide and contributed to the eventful emergence of sovereign Bangladesh through a nine-month war.

Among the recipients this time is a former Indian army officer Col (retd) Ashok Tara who rescued Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and other family members from the captivity of Pakistani troops from their house in Dhaka in 1971. Col Tara, now 70, also took part in several deadly battles with Pakistani troops in the war.

Late Indian Prime Minister Indira Gandhi was the first foreign friend to be conferred with the honour. Her daughter-inlaw and Congress President Sonia Gandhi received the honour on her behalf on July 25, 2011. In the second phase, Bangladesh awarded 83 with "Bangladesh Liberation War Honour" and "Friends of Liberation War Honour" on March 27.





REDRAWING JS CONSTITUENCIES EC to talk to political

parties after eid

The Election Commission (EC) will hold talks with political parties after the upcoming Eid-ul-Azha to seek their opinions on redrawing the boundaries of parliamentary constituencies, said Chief Election Commissioner Kazi Rakibuddin Ahmad yesterday.

"We hope all the political parties will join the talks and give us important suggestions on redrawing the boundaries of parliamentary constituencies," the CEC told reporters on the EC Secretariat premises.

In light of their suggestions, he said, a free and fair parliamentary election will be held in the coming days.

This will be the EC's first talks with registered political parties since it was constituted in this February. Earlier, the EC led by Rakibuddin held talks with civil

society personalities and senior journalists seeking their

opinion on the issue. Asked whether all political parties will be invited to sit together at talks with the EC, the CEC said, "You [reporters] will know when we will finalise the talk schedule."

Responding to another query, the CEC said the EC would use electronic voting machines in the Rangpur City Corporation polls, which will be held by December 25.
