

Ballack charged with speeding

Spanish police said Thursday they caught former Germany captain and Chelsea star Michael Ballack speeding on a highway in Spain -- reportedly at 211 kilometres (131 miles) per hour. "He was detained for excessive speed yesterday afternoon (Wednesday)," near the town of Trujillo in eastern Spain, a civil guard spokesman in the nearby city of Caceres told AFP by telephone. A court official in Trujillo said Ballack, 36, went before a local judge on Thursday morning and challenged the charges, meaning he will be summoned to appear before a judge in a Caceres

Russel aim to break final jinx

Star-studded Sheikh Russe KC are looking forward to

making their maiden final of the Federation Cup when they square off against traditional powerhouses Mohammedan SC in the first semifinal at the Bangabandhu National Stadium today. The game gets underway at 5:00pm.

Sheikh Russel have never reached the final of the season's curtainraising tournament since their appearance in the top-level football in 2003. The going is no easier this time, as they face a team aiming for their 15th final appearance in Mohammedan.

But the new Sheikh Russel is a strong team comprised of nine national players and three quality foreign players and if anyone can break this jinx, this team can, as evi-

denced by their four wins on the trot. The wins have also come in style, with Russel finding the back of the net 14 times.

Their compact-midfield comprising of Mamunul Islam, Moroccan Tarik El Janaby, Haitian Sony Norde and Zahid Hossain is the backbone behind Sheikh Russel's success and the team management will definitely be hoping for consistent performance from both forwards and midfielders in the crucial game.

Sheikh Russel may also take inspiration from their 2-0 win over Mohammedan in the group-stage match where they dominated in a deserved victory.

"It is a new game and new day so the players will have to prove themselves again," said Sheikh Russel coach Maruful Haque. "If the players can perform properly, we can hope to book the final seat."

On the other hand, Mohammedan

are also dreaming of the final berth for a record 15 times and for the first time in three seasons.

But the Black and Whites are happy to pass on the favourite tag, after surrendering to Russel in their group game and making it into this stage only after a pulsating shoot-out win against Team BJMC in the quarterfinal.

"We will go there as an underdog and play without pressure. We will try to avail every advantages," Mohammedan coach Saiful Bari Titu said. "But it is sure that we will take a cautious approach against them instead of adopting any attacking based game."

Titu, who last season guided Sheikh Jamal to win the Federation Cup, has also spotted weakness in the Sheikh Russel backline and wants to avail those gaps by utilizing the speedy Shohel Rana who will be back in the side after his one-match suspension.

NCL from tomorrow

"We have received all the squads. We had to bend our rules a little for Khulna to accommodate pacer Robiul Islam. This time he was not included in the Sylhet Division team and that's why we gave him to Khulna as their national pacer Rubel Hossain is uncertain" said Hafiz Joarder, member-secretary of the BCB's tournament committee.

He also informed that they met with umpires and match referees yesterday to talk about the bylaws and playing conditions.

"There was one major change in the playing condition -- a pacer can bowl a maximum of fifteen overs in a day. We took the decision as per national physio's advice and you know it is also followed in Ranji Trophy," informed Hafiz.

Unemployment hits Guinness record-holder Halim hard

It was only in January this year when Abdul Halim made the country, as well as the nation, proud by engraving his name in the Guinness World Records by balancing a football on his head for the farthest distance, 15.2 kilometres.

But the Guinness hero, stricken hard by poverty, has now been forced to play the role of a crowd-pleaser to earn a living as he has yet to be provided with a job opportunity.

"At the moment I have no other option but to display my abilities with the football and play the role of a crowd-pleaser as I have no fixed source of income. It's getting harder each day for me to meet the daily expenses of my four-member family," sighed Halim, after displaying some skills before the crowd at the RSKH School of Mohammadpur upazila headquarters in Magura recently.

Halim was called in by the school authority to display his skills

only for recreation of the students. After his shows during a two-hour break in between morning and day shifts, he was 'honoured' with an amount of Tk. 1,000, collected from the viewers.

Earlier, Halim was seen showing his skills at the Magura Government Girls' High School premises in the district town on September 20. And he doesn't know when the next invite will come his way through which he will be able to earn a small amount.

Halim's Guinness feat of walking

9.44 miles in two hours and five minutes was achieved on October 22, 2011 at the Bangabandhu National Stadium in Dhaka. He earned the authorities' recognition on January 24 this year.
