## Teachers without salaries for months

Teachers and employees of a prominent private school in Barisal city have not been getting their salaries for the last four months due to complications arising over the institution's management committee.

The victims said they did not get salaries and bonuses ahead of the last Eid, and it was uncertain this time too. They feared whether they could celebrate the forthcoming festivals of Durga Puja and Eid-ul-Azha this year.

Principal of Jagadish Saraswat Girls' High School and College Abu Md Faruk said it was unprecedented that the district education office stopped signing bills of salaries of the teachers

May this year.

The complications arose after Barisal Education Board dissolved the school management committee led by the sadar upazila Awami League convenor Anwar Hossain alias VP Anwar after completion of his one-year term on January 18.

The board also formed an ad-hoc managemnet committee on January 26, led by city Jubo League convenor Nizamuddin Nizam, who belongs to Anwar's rival faction.

On April 4, Anwar lodged a case with the High Court against the formation of the ad-hoc committee, saying he was removed illegally from the school management committee.

The case is now pending with the HC, and it is yet to be decided if there is a "functioning management committee" at the school. Salaries are not disbursed without a functioning committee.

The teachers alleged that the two AL rival factions were trying to lead the committee to misappropriate the fund approved for development of the college section of the institution.

District Education Officer Manowar Hossain said he signed the bills of monthly pay order (MPO) for February-May as per recommendation of the government pleader and stopped signing the bills further after the pleader refused to recommend that.

The pleader, Advocate KBS Ahmed Kabir, said he did not recommend the MPO bills as the HC had accused him of contempt of court for recommending the bills when the case regarding the committee was yet to be disposed of.

He advised the teachers and employees to appeal to court for getting an order to receive MPO bills.

The victims said they are taking preparation to go to court.

### TACKLING EID RUSH 35 out of 70 train carriages ready

# Road accidents kill seven

Seven people were killed and 22 others injured in road accidents in four districts on Thursday and yesterday.

Our Sylhet correspondent says, three persons, including two medical college students, were killed and 20 other students injured as a bus skidded off Dhaka-Sylhet highway near Notunbazar in Nabiganj upazila on Thursday midnight.

The dead, Mainuddin Khan of Luxmipur district and Shahidul Islam of Feni, were the students of Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College, while Abdul Mazid, 30, of village Sadarghat in the upazila.

Police said a group of 20 MBBS students were travelling to Chittagong by the bus which hit Mazid and skidded off the road, as its driver lost control over the steering, killing him and Mainuddin instantly. Shahidul was declared dead at the

## Ashrayon makes them self-reliant

Implementation of Ashrayon project, for the families of leprosy-affected people in Gazipur, has changed their lives from begging on the streets of Dhaka.

Visiting the site of "Protyasa Ashrayon Project" in Bandabari of Gazipur on Saturday, the news agency found leprosy patients and their family members, who used to beg, now self-reliant through different income generating activities like cow fattening, poultry farming and cultivating vegetables on land allocated by the government.

Habibur Rahman, who lost his six fingers and a leg due to leprosy, is running a cow-fattening project on a six-katha plot.

"I sold out three cows out of five recently and earned a handsome amount of money. I am planning to reinvest the money to expand my cow fattening project," he said adding many Asrayon dwellers, involved in farming and other trades, have a capital of Tk 4 to 5 lakh.

Protyasha Ashrayon, the first leper house was built on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's instruction in 2000 on 7.2 acres of land in Bandabari of Gazipur. The Ashrayon with a mosque, school, deep tube well, community centre, and pond has a population of 400, of them, 60 are leprosypatients.

The government and non-government organisations provided micro-credit and employment for the inhabitants.
