

















Authenticity of many Lalon Songs questioned

AMANUR AMAN, Kushtia

A bold demand for taking immediate steps to preserve the original songs of Lalon has Speakers, including baul song expo-

nents and baul singers, urged the government to take necessary steps in this regard. The demand came in a discussion held on the occasion of 122nd death anniversary of Fakir Lalon Shai at Cheuria, the den of the bard, on Thursday night. This was part of a five daylong programme running there.

"Government should take definitive initiatives to preserve the songs as it is now a confusion of which songs Lalon composed and what amount of songs are original,"

said Professor Dr. Abul Ahsan Choudhury, renowned folk researcher. Professor Ahsan was chief discussant at the event.

"Of the songs rendered as 'compositions of Lalon', some are false claims," Professor Ahsan said. According to researchers and exponents, Lalon composed about 1000 verses, which were noted down by Fakir Maniruddin, a direct disciple of the bard

According to Lalon researchers, after so many years of Lalon's death, many uninformed bauls have labelled songs composed by other baul gurus as Lalon's. For example, several songs composed by Gopal Shai and Adam Chan -- followers of Sati Mayer Ghar -- have been later claimed as Lalon's. Sharat Baul's song, "Chander gave

chand legechhe" and Mukundu Das' "Bolo ki shondhaney jai shekhaney" are often rendered as 'Lalon Geeti' by both urban

Dr. Md. Mohiuddin, chief executive officer of Kushtia Zilla Parishad, chaired the meeting. urban audience. Timeless songs of the bard were presented in authentic and contemporary urban styles.

Both arrangements were positive in the sense that they disseminated Lalon's philosophy among the city folks. The Shilpakala programme was held

under the open sky, as music has been performed traditionally, since time immemorial. The indoor programme at IGCC had a baithaki ambiance. Shilpakala's inclusion of films on Lalon

was an effort to show the bard's life and works in a more pragmatic way. Home Minister Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir, spoke at the discussion and vowed to uphold Lalon's legacy.

But what were missing in this concrete jungle, were the akhra mood, and the soft strumming of ektara or dotara that define Lalon songs in their place of origin.

On the other hand, Lalon's akhra is gradually losing its true colours and is turning into more of a tourist attraction. Artistes from Dhaka regularly feature in the Chheuria programmes.

So, what if people here in Dhaka enjoy the same songs, by the same voices? At least, Lalon's message is reaching out to a wider audience in this concrete jungle.




