tant violation of the University Grants Commission's guidelines, which clearly state that any earnings using the university's monogram must be deposited with the university's account. This practice of pocketing money from sales of forms has been going on at the RU since the late '90s.

With more than 2.42 lakh admission seekers flocking to the RU, the authorities this year realised the financial potential of the situation and raised the number of units from 14 to 16, under which the applicants took tests. Other public universities run admission tests under four units.

An official at the RU accounts department termed the admission process a trade and said an admission seeker had to pay Tk 5,100 to get the forms of all 16 units, more than thrice the fees for the forms of all four units at Dhaka University.
