

Dashing Bangladesh lefthanded batsman Tamim Iqbal could not have asked for a better return to domestic first-class cricket -- a format he has been absent from for the last five years as the Chittagong skipper scored a stellar 176 not out against Dhaka Metro at the Shaheed Chandu Stadium in Bogra yesterday.

The fiery innings on a flat track, his personal best in first-class cricket, witnessed 20 boundaries and helped Chittagong post a sizeable total on the first day.

"I have been waiting to play this kind of an innings for a long time. I haven't played such a satisfying innings since my century (103) in Lord's two years ago. Most of all, I'm happy that I could bat through the entire day and remain not out," said Tamim after the day's play.

Tamim, who was ably supported by youngster Mominul Haque's 120, further stated that he wanted to make the most of the NCL matches before the beginning of the series against the West Indies.

"The wicket was fantastic for batting, which helped me to play my natural game. I had a target before the tournament to fully utilise the two NCL rounds before the West Indies series, so this is a SEE PAGE 17 COL 5

# Tamim off to 'dream start' Batsmen sparkle on Day One hurt in collision

The 14th National Cricket League (NCL) began on a bright note yesterday, with batsmen grabbing the spotlight at all venues except Mirpur. Two Chittagong batsmen scored centuries on the first day, national batsman Tamim Iqbal among them. His teammate and promising southpaw Mominul Haque delivered a timely reminder to the national selectors ahead of the West Indies tour with an unbeaten 120 in partnership with Tamim at the Shaheed Chandu Stadium in Bogra. Tamim, who remained not out on 176, took the attack to the Dhaka Metro bowlers as he flayed the ball to all corners of the park.

At the Cricket Garden in Rangpur Soumya Sarkar's 96 off 94 balls helped Khulna reach a decent total against Barisal as the young batsman carried on the good form he showed in the recently concluded series against the West Indies High Performance Squad. Naeem Islam, who is fighting for a return to the national side, ended the day on 88 not out and guided Rangpur against the more experienced Sylhet Division at the Sheikh Abu Naser Stadium in Khulna.

The only low-scoring game took place at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur between Dhaka Division and Rajshahi. The game saw Saqlain Sajib pick four wickets for Rajshahi, before a collision with Captain Mushfigur Rahim forced both players to leave the ground near the end of the Dhaka innings.

The Chittagong batsmen made the most of their decision to bat first on a good wicket. A 266-run partnership between Tamim Iqbal and Mominul Haque dominated the proceedings as the team finished the day on 345 for 2. Both Tamim and Mominul remained not out after scoring their respective centuries. Earlier, Chittagong had lost Nafees Iqbal and Nazimuddin before lunch. BCB physician Dr. Debashish Chowdhury later informed that Bangladesh and Rajshahi skipper Mushfiqur Rahim would be able to bat today while Saqlain Sajib was admitted to the Apollo Hospital, although there was nothing alarming in the CT scan he underwent.

Saiful Bari Titu has once more been given the responsibility of coaching the national team for an exhibition match against Thailand in November and the national U-23s for a six-nation invitational tournament in Sri Lanka in December.

The Bangladesh national team are scheduled to play an exhibition match against Thailand on November 18 while the national U-23 team are supposed to travel to Sri Lanka to take part in an invitational tournament scheduled for December 1-10.

Satyajit Das Rupu, a member of the National Teams Committee, informed yesterday that some 35 to 40 players would be called up for a five-day camp which will start from November 1 and end on November 5, five days before the start of the sixth edition of the professional football league.

The national team will fly on November 15 while the U-23 team are expected to leave here for Sri Lanka on SEE PAGE 17 COL 2
