Greig will undergo a biopsy next week on his lung to precisely diagnose the seriousness of the cancer.

Titu, who is also coach of Mohammedan SC, had earlier been appointed to coach the national team in two FIFA International Friendlies against Nepal in September though Bangladesh had played only one friendly on September 20 -- a 1-1 draw -- after the first

one was washed out due to rain. "The national team is always the first priority to me and I am ready to take charge of both sides," said Titu, who was on Friday assaulted by Mohammedan supporters after the Black & Whites' 2-1 loss to Sheikh Russel KC in the Federation Cup semifinal at the Bangabandh National Stadium.

The former national footballer was disappointed and upset with the incident but no Mohammedan official contacted him as of yesterday noon. Titu is now considering whether he should continue with the Black & Whites.

"I expected my club will support me in this situation but surprisingly nobody from the club has called me yet. Now I am seriously thinking whether I will continue my relationship with them,' said a disappointed Titu.

The spectators are often entered into the field soon after the final whistle due to lack of security measures and all responsibilities regarding the security fall on the shoulder of the Bangladesh Football Federation.

BFF president Kazi Salahuddin told reporters that they would not tolerate such indiscipline on the field and take actions against the parties related to the incident. He also promised that there will not be a repeat of such an incident in future.

Meanwhile, Football Coaches Association of Bangladesh condemned the attack on its information secretary Titu and demanded immediate punishment of the culprits and the provision of adequate security during matches.
