### India to open its economy to neighbours High Commissioner Pankaj Saran speaks on regional trade

India is developing infrastructure in its border areas to increase trade with neighbouring countries, Pankaj Saran, the Indian high commissioner to Bangladesh, said yesterday.

The move comes on the back of India's decision to open up its economy to its neighbours, Saran said.

Saran spoke at a seminar, 'Prospects of Sub-Regional Cooperation involving Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Bhutan and Myanmar', organised by the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry at the capital's Ruposhi Bangla Hotel.

The proposed platform will complement the existing

South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC), although three SAARC countries -- Sri Lanka, Pakistan and Maldives -- have been excluded from it.

"India is ready to continue discussion on subregional cooperation," Saran said.

Bangladesh Foreign Minister Dipu Moni urged the neighbouring countries for greater regional cooperation in water resource management.

"Seamless visible connectivity will help grow regional trade," she said.

Improving transport infrastructure is needed for greater regional trade, said Moazzem Hossain, editor of The Financial Express.

# Bahrain Air resumes Dhaka flights

Bahrain Air will resume direct flights to Dhaka on Wednesday, the Gulf nation's private sector carrier said in a statement yesterday.

The flights had remained suspended since April 2011. Three weekly flights will be operated on Saturdays,

Thursdays and Wednesdays where Airbus 319 with twoclass configuration will be used. The inaugural flight will reach Hazrat Shahjalal Inter-

national Airport in Dhaka at 6:05am on Wednesday and depart for Bahrain at 6:50am.

"Dhaka is important to Bahrain Air's flight operations in terms of demand and load factor. The route remains active across the year and the numbers of connecting passengers are very high," said Richard Nuttall, chief executive officer of Bahrain Air.

"We are glad to have Dhaka back. Now we are very much ready to resume the operations of our flights to this important station and extend our services to the Bangladeshi community in the region."
