# China offers to invest more

Signs 3 deals to boost cooperation

China wants to increase its investment in Bangladesh, especially in energy, agriculture and infrastructure development, a highlevel Chinese delegation told Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina during a meeting yesterday.

Li Changchun, a member of the standing committee of the Political Bureau of the Communist Party of China (CPC) Central Committee, led the delegation.

After the meeting, Dhaka and Beijing signed three instruments -- an agreement, one MoU and a framework accord -- to boost cooperation in economic, power and financial assistance.

Li offered Chinese assistance in the expansion of the Pagla Water Treatment Plant in Narayanganj during the meeting, PM's Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad told journalists at the Prime Minister's Office. The premier welcomed the Chinese offer,

and urged Beijing to import more from Bangladesh to bring about a balance in bilateral trade, Azad said. Hasina offered land in the special eco-

nomic zones if the Chinese government relocate some of their industries to Bangladesh, reports UNB.

# Ginger prices shoot up

Traders in the capital have increased the prices of onion, garlic and ginger, cashing in on their growing demand ahead of Eid-ul-

In the last month, onion prices on average rose by 22 percent to Tk 28-38 from Tk 22-32 a kg, according to the Trading Corporation of Bangladesh,

an organisation that monitors prices of essentials. The prices of

Chinese garlic shot up by 26.67 percent to Tk 150 from Tk 130 a kg a month ago. In the last week, its prices rose on average by Tk 25 a kg.

In the last month, ginger prices went up by 50 percent to Tk 60-90 from Tk 40-60 a kg.

Consumers demand close monitoring of markets, which will control price hikes before eid.

# People kept in the dark

AL turns its back on polls pledge

Wealth statements and sources of income of the prime minister, ministers, lawmakers and their family members have not been made public even nearly four years after Awami League came to power with an electoral pledge to ensure it every year to establish good governance.

The ruling party made the pledge in its election manifesto before the 2008 parliamentary polls in the wake of serious allegations of corruption against ministers and lawmakers of previous governments.

was amended in its national council in mid-2009, also included the same commitment.

But the present AL-led government seems to be following the footsteps of the previous BNP-led alliance government that also did not fulfil its electoral pledge to

disclose wealth statements of ministers and lawmakers.

The electoral laws made it possible for people to know about the wealth of all candidates contesting the 2008 parliamentary polls, as their wealth statements were made public in line with the laws during the election.

The current government made a move to implement the electoral pledge in March last year, more than two years after it came to power in January 2009. But the move failed to yield any result.

And it remains uncertain whether the AL-led government will The party's manifesto, which implement its pledge in the last one year of its tenure.

The cabinet purchase committee on economic affairs on March 16 last year decided to implement the ruling party's electoral pledge over submission and disclosure of wealth statements.
