Destiny director Didarul on remand

Lt Col (retd) Didarul Alam, a director of the controversial Destiny Group, was placed on an eight-day remand yesterday in a moneylaundering case filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission.

Metropolitan Magistrate Tanvir Ahmed passed the order after ACC Deputy Director Mojahar Ali Sardar, also investigation officer of the case, produced him before a Dhaka court yesterday, seeking a 10-day remand.

Didarul, also a director of Destiny Agro Industries and chief executive officer of Destiny Builders, was arrested at Mohakhali on Saturday.

Meanwhile, the ACC yesterday filed a petition with the Supreme Court for a stay on the High Court order that granted twomonth conditional bail to Destiny Group President Lt Gen (retd) M Harun-Ar-Rashid in two moneylaundering cases.

Harun, who is shown as a director of the group in case documents, was released on Saturday.

ACC's lawyer Khurshid Alam Khan filed the petition, which might be heard today.

Earlier on Wednesday, Rafiqul Amin, chairman and managing director of the Destiny Group, and Mohammad Hossain, chairman of Destiny 2000 Ltd, were placed on an 18-day remand in two moneylaundering cases.

They were being interrogated about the laundered money.

On October 11, a Dhaka court sent Harun, Rafiqul and Hossain to jail.

CTG-KUNMING ROAD, RAIL LINKS China to initiate negotiations

CPC leader tells Khaleda

The Chinese government will take the initiative to set up a meeting among China, Bangladesh and Myanmar on establishing direct rail and road links between Chittagong and Kunming. A top-ranking Communist Party of China (CPC)

leader, Li Changchun, said this during a call on by aneight member BNP delegation led by BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia in the capital's Sonargaon Hotel yesterday. "As part of regional connectivity, China is giving prior-

ity to establish the direct rail and road communication via Myanmar," BNP Vice President Shamsher Mobin Chowdhury told journalists after the call on.

China also reiterated its commitment to help construct the second Padma bridge and a deep-sea port in Sonadia, said the former foreign secretary. Li Changchun, member of the Standing Committee of

the Political Bureau of CPC Central Committee, also informed Khaleda that China would continue assisting Bangladesh modernise its railway and road infrastructure, he said. During the 45-minute meeting from 3:30pm, Khaleda

and Li Changchun emphasised close cooperation between CPC and BNP.

Li Changchun, arriving in Dhaka on Saturday with an eight-member high-powered delegation for a two-day visit at the invitation of the ruling Awami League, also visited North South University's Confucius Institute where he was given a red-carpet reception. The Chinese delegation presented a statue of Chinese philosopher Confucius to the institute.

Road crashes kill 8, injure 11

Road accidents killed eight people and injured eleven others in Dhaka, Barisal, Rajshahi, Joypurhat, Jhenaidah, Dinajpur and Natore on Saturday and yesterday.

Our staff correspondent reports, Narayan Mujumdar, 37, died after a bus hit him in the capital's Dhanmondi area yesterday afternoon.

In Dinajpur, Rubel, 20, was killed and five others were injured after a bus hit a tractor at Hazaratpur in Chirirbandar yesterday morning.

In Natore, cattle trader Lutfar, 40, of Gazipur, was killed and another injured in a two trucks' head-on collision in Mashisdanga of Baraigram upazila early yesterday.

UNB from Barisal reports, Imran, 14, a class X student of Armed Police Battalion School, died after being hit by a bus before Brac office in Barisal yesterday.

Meanwhile, rickshaw van puller Abdur Rob Shikdar, 50, was killed and Abdul Ali, 53, injured after a truck hit the van at Bhurghata in Gournadi yesterday morning.

In Rajshahi, Rejaul Karim, 45, of

Chapainawabganj, was killed and three others were injured as a bus hit a human hauler at Bijoynagar in Godagari yesterday morning.

BSS from Joypurhat reports, Kazimuddin, 45, died as a bus hit his motorbike on Akkelpur-Tilakpur road at Jafarpur in Akkelpur upazila yesterday morning.

In Jhenaidah, motorcycle rider Mokaddes Hossain, 20, son of Shahidul Islam of Narayanganj, was killed and his elder brother injured as a bus hit the motorcycle in Kagmari area on Saturday.

DoE fines errant businesses

The Department of Environment (DoE) fined owners of a paper mill, a textile mill and two illegal brick fields around Tk 40 lakh in Narayanganj and Barguna yesterday.

In Narayanganj, a DoE enforcement team found that the paper mill was running for the past two years without environmental clearance and an effluent treatment plant, while the textile mill was found grossly faulty, said a press release.

The mills were fined Tk 31 lakh for polluting river with untreated chemical effluent, it said.

There was no dissolved oxygen in the effluent released by the paper mill, while the level of oxygen in the effluent of the textile mill was 0.6 milligram per litre although it should have been at least 4.5 milligram.

Meanwhile, the DoE fined owners of two illegal brick fields around Tk 9 lakh for grabbing part of Bishkhali River and disrupting the river course in Barguna.

Owners of the brick fields were also ordered to clear bricks and earth filling from the river within a week, said another DoE press release. City in the capital.
