"We are concerned about the proposed amendment to the Company Law 1994," AK Azad, president of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI), told reporters at

WB to sit with co-financiers

ACC sends all documents to WB panel to respond to queries

The World Bank will shortly sit with the co-financiers to discuss implementation of the Padma bridge project, said WB Bangladesh Country Director Ellen Goldstein yesterday.

"There will be a joint mission meeting with the co-financiers to begin discussions on some changes in implementation of the project.... It's a complicated implementation process with some large-scale tendering activities," Goldstein said.

Trips home turn horrible

Eid holidaymakers suffer for tailbacks on all highways

People leaving the capital to spend Eid holidays suffered badly yesterday as vehicles remained stranded for hours or moved very slowly on different highways.

The situation was worst on the Dhaka-Mawa highway. To be ferried across the river Padma, buses had to wait for four to six hours and goods-carrying trucks three to four days because of reduced ferry services.

On Mawa-Kawrakandi route, ferries operated through two alternative terminals -- Mawa intersection and Hrishibari -- after the BIWTC on Monday declared erosion-hit ferry terminals 2 and 3 abandoned while the Padma devoured the terminal-1.
