BSMMU treasurer quits amid row

Treasurer of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU) Prof Moazzam Hossain resigned yesterday as some syndicate members questioned the validity of his continuing in the position under contractual appointment.

The controversy arose at Saturday's syndicate meeting when some members asked whether Prof Moazzam, who retired this June, could continue as treasurer in contradiction to the university ordinance, which says only regular teachers are eligible for appointment to the post. Prof Moazzam became the treasurer of BSMMU on

March 25, 2009. He retired as a regular teacher from the

university on June 30 this year. He was continuing as treasurer, as the university administration appointed him on contract as a professor for one more year from June 30, with his first appointment letter saying he would continue in this position until further notice. Asked whether a professor on contractual appointment could continue as treasurer as per the BSMMU

ordinance, Vice Chancellor Prof Pran Gopal Datta said they had sought opinion from the health and law ministries, and both the ministries gave positive nod. Prof Moazzam told The Daily Star that he submitted his

resignation letter to the vice chancellor yesterday morning. The VC said he had forwarded the letter to BSMMU Chancellor and President Zillur Rahman. He also said Prof Moazzam, former chairman of the Paediatric Nephrology Department and ex-president of

BSMMU Teachers' Association, felt embarrassed when

his matter was discussed at the syndicate meeting. BSMMU sources said Pro-Awami League doctors' body Swadhinata Chikitshak Parishad's Secretary General Prof Iqbal Arslan and Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists President Iqbal Sobhan Chowdhury, among others, questioned Prof Moazzam's treasurership.

Cooking essentials' prices jump for eid

Prices of various cooking ingredients have shot up in less than a month as traders kept supplies tight to make fat profit out of the increased demand ahead of Eid-ul Azha.

Pressure on consumers' wallets, however, is likely to remain less as edible oil, sugar, and chicken sell at lower prices.

The quick surge in prices of cooking ingredients, which is as much as 40 percent in the case of imported garlic, has irked buyers. "We are aggrieved," said General Secretary of the

Kabir Bhuyia. "Traders have increased prices of almost all the cook-

ing ingredients needed on the occasion of Eid-ul Azha." "How come prices of onion and spices shot up all on a sudden," he asked. "It reflects government's failure to monitor the market closely."

Over the last three-four weeks, prices of onion, garlic, ginger and aromatic spices have increased in the city markets.

Onion prices rose by 22 percent to Tk 28-38 a

kilogramme at retails from Tk 22-32 early this month, according to the Trading Corporation of Bangladesh (TCB). Two wholesalers at the capital's Shyambazar blamed

reduced supply of Indian onion through import for its price spike. Price of one kilogramme of imported garlic, which was

Tk 100-110 early this month, jumped to Tk 145-150 at retails, indicating a 50 percent rise. Ginger was traded at Tk 60-90 a kg at retails in the city

markets from Tk 50-80 a month ago, according to TCB. A wholesaler at Shyambazar, Narayan Chandra Saha, however, said prices of onion, garlic and ginger slipped in the last couple of days at the wholesale market amid low

Apart from these cooking ingredients, prices of cardamom, whole cloves and cinnamon also have leapt upward in the last one and half months.
