Durga Puja ends with idol immersion in Ctg

Durga Puja, the largest festival of the Hindu community, culminated in Bijoya Dashami yesterday with the immersion of idols of the goddess Durga.

In Chittagong, nearly 250 idols were immersed in the river Karnaphuli and Bay of Bengal at spots like Kalurghat, Southkattoli, Pathor Ghata Gongabari, Enayet Bazar Goal Para Pond and Patenga Sea Beach, which saw the highest number of immersions as usual.

Nearly 150 idols of the puja mandaps of the port city were immersed at Patenga beach, which is the main immersion centre. Nearly one lakh Hindu devotees thronged the Patenga beach to see off the goddess this year, said Suman Debnath, general secretary of Chittagong City Puja Udjapon Parishad.

The immersion process started from noon with idols of Durga and her children -- Laksmi, Sarashwati, Kartik and Ganesha -- being carried in trucks, along with Hindu devotees of all ages, to the immersion points.

India reaches out to Khaleda Zia

With Bangladesh set to go to polls next year, India has reached out to the opposition leader and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia by inviting her to visit New Delhi next week, reported The Times of India yesterday.

Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pankaj Saran met Khaleda in Dhaka to discuss her engagements for the visit.

Khaleda is expected to meet President Pranab Mukherjee on October 28. The date for her meeting with PM Manmohan Singh is being finalised. She is also expected to visit Ajmer, it said.

While BNP has always been known for its anti-India stance, New Delhi knows that it is imperative to at least make an attempt to mend fences with her in the run up to the general elections.

BNP, known for its links with Pakistan, has of late been looking to make new friends in the region, it said.

India has managed to add some substance to its relations with Bangladesh during the ongoing tenure of the government led by Awami League's Sheikh Hasina but it knows that ties with BNP are crucial to make this process irreversible.

The port city of Chittagong looked deserted yesterday as many of its residents left early to celebrate Durga Puja, Eid-ul Azha and Shubho Probarona Purnima, the dates of which fell in succession this year.

Yesterday was a general holiday for Durga Puja, the biggest festival of the Hindu community. The Eid-ul Azha holiday begins tomorrow and ends on October 28.

Shubho Probarona Purnima, the second largest festival of the Buddhist community, will be celebrated on October 29. The only working day in between is today. As many

jobholders took the day off to keep to the spell of holidays, presence in the government, autonomous and private offices is expected to be thin today. Chittagong Railway Station, bus stands in Kadamtoli,

Station Road, Dampara and Oxygen, shopping malls and kitchen markets, crowded with people only a few days ago, looked desolate. The presence of vehicles on the roads was thin while

passenger numbers on the local buses and minibuses were also low. Those selling tickets of long-distance buses at Dampara said there was no rush of passengers.
