Hall-Mark factories shut down

Indefinite closure notice comes during eid holiday

Controversial business group Hall-Mark yesterday shut down its factories at Hemayetpur in Savar sine die, keeping the police and local administration in the dark.

Abdul Baten, an inspector of Industrial Police in Savar, said at midnight yesterday they found the closure notices pasted at the entrances of the factories. "We are trying to find out who have pasted the notices."

A Bangladesh Bank investigation in May revealed that the group embezzled over Tk 2,686 crore from the state-owned Sonali Bank's Ruposhi Bangla Hotel branch between 2010 and 2012 on forged documents.

The factories went on Eid holidays from October 26 and were supposed to be reopened on November 3, said Mohammad Moniruzzaman, deputy director of Industrial Police.

POLLS-DAY VIOLATION OF LAWS EC against army's arrest power

The present Election Commission does not want the armed forces to get back their sweeping authority to arrest anyone without warrant on election day for violating electoral laws.

The previous EC led by ATM Shamsul Huda had proposed restoring the provision in the Representation of the People Order to give back the authority to the army, the navy and the air force.

But the current EC headed by Kazi Rakibuddin Ahmad has decided not to ask

the government for restoring the provision, said a source in the EC.

It is now drafting a set of proposals for electoral reforms that will soon be sent to the government for turning them into law.

"We do not see any necessity of restoring the provision. The government is obligated to deploy the armed forces, if we ask for it to maintain law and order during the parliamentary election," Election Commissioner Shah Nawaz told The Daily Star recently.

Razakar was launched with 96 Jamaat men Investigator tells war crimes trial

After two prosecution witnesses, an investigator of international crimes tribunal yesterday also said Jamaat-e-Islami leader AKM Yusuf formed the Razakar force, an auxiliary force of the Pakistani army, during the Liberation War.

"Through investigation, I have found that the Razakar force was formed with 96 Jamaat activists at an Ansar camp at Khan Jahan Ali Road of Khulna under the leadership of AKM Yusuf [in May 1971]," investigator Matiur Rahman told the

International Crimes Tribunal-1.

During his daylong cross-examination yesterday, Matiur, the investigation officer of the crimes against humanity case against Jamaat's former chief Ghulam Azam, said he got the information from locals and newspaper reports published even after the war.

Earlier, eminent war crimes researcher Shahriar Kabir and journalist Mahbub Kamal, the first and third prosecution witness in the case against Jamaat leader Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mujahid, told the

A man claiming to have survived a boat capsiz in the Bay of Bengal on Saturday while going to Malaysia illegally was found by locals of Teknaf yesterday morning.

He was identified as Abu Bakar, 22, of Delpara of Sabrang union under Teknaf.

The locals on hearing Bakar's story handed him over to Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB).

According to what Bakar told the BGB members, he

Food, water shortage at victims' camps: UN

APP, Sittwe

Food, water and medical help are in short supply at camps in western Myanmar that are "stretched beyond capacity", a UN agency yesterday said as authorities struggled to stem communal clashes.

Buddhist-Muslim bloodshed in Rakhine state has caused more than 28,000 people to flee their homes this month, the United Nations refugee agency said in a statement.

"It is clearly urgent that law and order be restored to prevent further violence,

and that access is facilitated so that aid can be provided to those in need," the agency said.

The ongoing fighting, which erupted on October 21 and killed dozens, has seen whole neighbourhoods razed in a spate of arson attacks that United Nations staff said had resulted in "widespread destruction and displacement".

Thousands from mainly Muslim communities in Rakhine state have streamed towards camps already struggling to cope with the 75,000 people displaced by



Lone Bengal Tiger at Ctg zoo dies

The only Bengal Tiger at the Chittagong zoo died yesterday, leaving the zoo without tigers.

The tiger, named Purnima, had been suffering from intestinal cancer for around three years, said Manjur Moshed Chowdhury, veterinary officer of the zoo.

A Bengal Tiger usually lives about 15 to 16 years in captivity, said the vet. Purnima, however, lived 19 years. During the last week, she could not take any food and was on saline, he added.

Visitors to the zoo said they felt unhappy about the demise of the only tiger.
