Khalaf murder trial begins

Trial of Saudi embassy official Khalaf Al Ali murder case began at a Dhaka court yesterday with deposition of the complainant.

Gulshan Police Station's Sub-Inspector Mosharraf Hossain, also the case's complainant, gave his statement and was later cross-examined on behalf of the accused.

After the cross-examination, Judge Mohammad Motahar Hossain of Speedy Trial Tribunal-4 fixed

November 4 for next hearing of the case. The judge also rebuked SI Mosharraf Hossain for not following the existing law's provisions when preparing an inquest report on slain Khalaf Al Ali.

On March 6, the SI made an inquest report but in it he did not mention the primary reasons behind Khalaf's death. The same court, earlier on Wednesday, framed charges

against five accused in the case. The accused are Mohammad Al Amin, Saiful Islam

Mamun, Rafiqul Islam Khokon, Akbar Ali Lalu and Selim Chowdhury. Of them, Selim is on the run while the others are in police custody.

Khalaf, an official at the consular section of the Saudi embassy in Dhaka, was shot dead near his Gulshan house in the capital's diplomatic enclave on March 6 this year.

ETV chairman indicted Workers demand govt open Hall-Mark factories

A platform of garment workers yesterday demanded that the government open all the factories of Hall-Mark Group in Savar and start operating those under its supervision to secure the workers' job.

Garments Sramik Sangram Parishad also demanded disbursement of all arrears among the 17,000 workers, saying that their job had been thrown into uncertainty with the unexpected closure of the factories.

The factory workers should not be victimised for the Hall-Mark owners' fraudulence, the platform leaders told a

could not confirm if the Hall-Mark authorities or a government committee formed to run the factories slapped the notices.

The uncertainty among the workers arouse as Hall-Mark's top brass, including the managing director and the chairman, have been arrested after the group was found to have embezzled Tk 2,686 crore on loan from Sonali Bank.

The factories went on Eid-ul-Azha vacation on October 26 and were supposed to reopen tomorrow.

The platform leaders will submit memorandums to several ministries, including labour and employment, and other offices on November 4 and stage a demonstration before Jatiya Press Club on November 5.

Advocate Mahbubur Rahman Ismail, coordinator of the platform, read out a written speech at the conference.
