

The board had launched a moneyspinning tournament like the BPL without any legal framework, engendering chaos and tarnishing the country's cricketing image on the international stage through the nonpayment of players and officials. On another front, the way the board negotiated with Pybus not only put a premature end to the Englishman's stint with the Bangladesh national team but also darkened the question mark over BCB's professionalism.

And lastly, if proof be needed that nothing can be achieved in the professional world through whimsical decisions, Kamal's ambitious but unrealistic intentions regarding the introduction of franchise-based first-class cricket and its eventual abandonment certainly provided it. NSC meeting by next Monday

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) president Nazmu Hassan Papon will discuss issues regarding the BCB con stitution and board elections with the high-ups of the National Sports Council (NSC) by next Monday.

"Our president (Nazmul Hassan Papon) will first talk with the legal adviser because there are some issues and confusion about some clauses in the recommendation and then he will meet with the NSC officials by next Monday," informed BCB's media committee chairman Jalal Yunus after the board meeting at Mirpur yesterday.

The NSC, the country's sports regulatory authority, in its recommendation on the amended constitution made some very interesting observations and asked the board to adopt those in the constitution 'before sending it back to the NSC'.

Regarding the Pakistan tour, Yunus said that the BCB's new president will talk with the concerned authorities before taking any decision about the tour.

"The issue of the Pakistan tour was also discussed in the board meeting. Before he (Papon) was appointed president, a letter was sent to the Pakistan board which stated that Bangladesh will tour Pakistan. Our new president is keen to keep the commitment but he will talk with the concerned authorities before taking any decision regarding the issue because security is a major issue,"



Last chance to impress

NCL 2nd round begins today

The all-important second Refrigerator round of the National Cricket

League (NCL) begins today after a short break for eid. The round will be the last chance for certain players to make an impression on the national selectors. Chief selector Akram Khan has already said that Bangladesh's long hiatus from Test cricket has put him and his team in a spot of bother.

In the second round matches, Dhaka take on Dhaka Metro at the Sher-e-Bangla National Cricket Stadium in Mirpur while Sylhet meet Chittagong at the BKSP,

Khulna face off with Rangpur at the Sheikh Abu Naser Stadium in Khulna and holders Rajshahi play against Barisal at the Sheikh Kamruzzaman Stadium in Rajshahi.

The national players will look to improve on their individual performances as apart from Tamim Iqbal's dashing centuries, none of the other players managed to adjust themselves to the longer format of the game in the first round of matches. With the first Test match just a little more than a week away, this is the one area that Mushfiqur Rahim and Co. will want to concentrate on.

The second round will also receive a fillip with the inclusion of all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan. The left handed player, who returned last week after his stint with Indian Premier League team Kolkata Knight Riders in the Champions League T20 in South Africa, is expected to play for Khulna. He'll be playing the longer version of the game after a string of Twenty20 matches and the team management will definitely hope that their best wickettaking bowler adjusts to the game as quickly as possible.

There'll be a special focus on Mominul Haque and Enamul Haque Jr. who, according to Akram, have a good chance of making it to the national fold. Mominul had scored a century in the first game and Enamul continued his good run with a sixwicket haul against Rangpur. The chief selector had earlier stated that the majority of the positions in the team have already been taken, which means that a bunch of younger players who performed well in the first round of the NCL, namely Marshal Ayub and Shohag Gazi, might have to wait for a longer period to attain a place in the national side.

The Bangladesh women's cricket team returned yesterday after participating in the ACC Women's Twenty20 Asia Cup in Guangzhou, China.

Captain Salma Khatun expressed her satisfaction over her team's performance in the tournament, although she believed that it could have been much better if they put in a satisfactory batting performance during the tournament.

Bangladesh beat Nepal, hosts China and Sri Lanka to qualify for the semifinal but failed to make it to the final, losing to Pakistan by six wickets at the semifinal stage.

"Our performance was not bad in the tournament and I'm happy with the outcome. The most important thing is that we are improving day by day. Our bowling and fielding was really good but we have to improve our bat-

ting," said Salma. "I think we were a better side than Pakistan but we lost in the

BFF ACADEMY'S TALENT HUNT FIFA director likely

for final selection

FIFA technical director Jean Michel Benezet is likely to conduct the final selection of the booters for the Bangladesh Football Federation Academy in December as the divisional phase of the talent hunt has almost been completed last month.

Some 120 booters -- Under-14 and U-18 -- from six divisions have already been picked for the final selection while the rest of the 20 to 30 booters from the Dhaka division are still to be finalised. 60 youth footballers from the final list of 150 booters will be picked for the BFF Academy in Sylhet but unfortunately, the renovation and furniture installment at Sylhet still depends on the approval of the finance ministry.

"We told FIFA that we are ready for the final selection and requested them to send their team in the first week of December but they can't send their team due to busy schedule of FIFA technical director. However, they have assured us that they would complete the selection process by December," said BFF acting general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag, hinting that the FIFA technical
