# PM to visit Pakistan to attend D-8 summit

Dhaka seeks Pak apology for 1971 genocide; Hina for moving ahead turning back to the past

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has decided to pay a three-day official visit to Pakistan to attend the D-8 summit in Islamabad scheduled for November 22.

Hasina goes to Pakistan against the background of her government asking Islamabad to settle all pending post-independence issues. Dhaka has demanded an unconditional apology from Islamabad for the genocide Pakistan carried out

during the Liberation War in 1971.

This will be Sheikh Hasina's first visit to Pakistan since she returned to power in 2009. She will leave on November 21 and return home on November 23 after taking part in the eighth D-8 summit. She last visited Pakistan in 1998 in her first term

as prime minister.

# Ministry pushes for costly deal

Cost to rise if the unsolicited deal is finalised

To repair urgently the sixth unit of Ghorashal power plant that went out of order in July 2010, the power ministry is negotiating an unsolicited deal with an Indian company with a price tag three times that in a contract for the same work which failed two months ago. The sixth unit of the gas-fired 210-megawatt

plant, built by Russain company Technoprompexport, went bust due to faults of the plant's officials and staff. The plant's turbine and generator needed replacement.

The Power Development Board floated a restricted tender for urgent repair of the plant that produced power at a cheap cost, and two Russian companies and an Indian company participated in the bid. The Russian companies -- Technopromexport (the plant's builder) and Inter Roues -- sought around \$27 million to \$30 million and the Indian company-- Swati -

: Asset disclosure for Chinese officials is ; likely to be slowly phased in over time, a senior Chinese Communist Party leader said yesterday, as the government grapples with the fraught task of rooting out the corruption.

The comments from Wang Yang, a

member of the decision-making Politburo with a reputation as a reformer, came a day after the party opened a weeklong congress to install a new leadership with a call to fight corruption.

Speaking to reporters, Wang said that the province he runs, Guangdong, is exploring methods for officials to declare
