It's a common grumble that politicians' lifestyles are far removed from those of their electorate. Not so in Uruguay. Meet the president - who lives on a ramshackle farm and gives away most of his pay.

Laundry is strung outside the house. The water comes from a well in a yard, overgrown with weeds. Only two police officers and Manuela, a three-legged dog, keep watch outside.

This is the residence of the president of Uruguay, Jose Mujica, whose

5 suspects freed on Babar's order

Ex-cop tells court in 10-truck arms cases

Police had detained five suspected activists of United Liberation Front of Assam (Ulfa) in connection with the seizure of 10-truck arms and ammunition in 2004 and later freed them upon receiving an order from former state minister for home Lutfuzzaman Babar.

Ex-OC of Karnaphuli Police Station Ahadur Rahman told this to Metropolitan Special Tribunal-1 here yesterday in his deposition as prosecution witness in two cases in this connection, said court sources.

Former commissioner of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) SM Sabbir Ali had initially barred Ahadur from lodging any case over the

Suu Kyi declines to back Rohingyas

Says 'illegal immigration from Bangladesh' must be stopped

Even as the country accommodates thousands of Rohingyas despite its own population and poverty problems, Aung San Suu Kyi says illegal immigration from Bangladesh has to be stopped.

Suu Kyi, on a visit to neighbouring India, yesterday said she had declined to speak out on behalf of stateless Rohingya Muslims who live on both sides of the border because she wanted to promote reconciliation after the recent bloodshed.

More than 1,00,000 people have been displaced in Myanmar since June in two major outbreaks of violence in the western state of Rakhine.

But, for Bangladesh, the intrusion of Rohingyas from
