

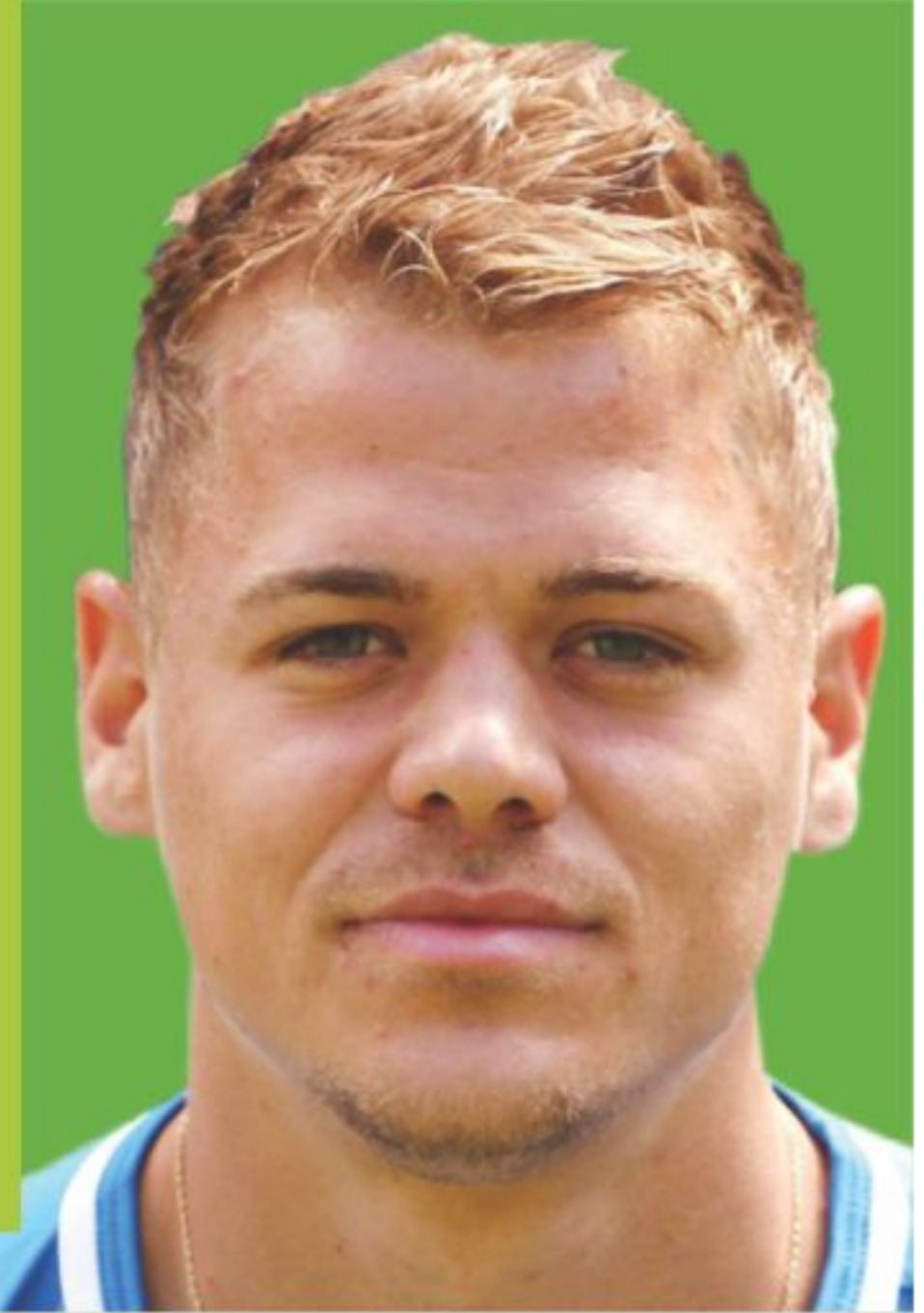

## Vukcevic regains consciousness

Hoffenheim star Boris Vukcevic, who was seriously injured when his car was in collision with a lorry in September, woke up on Friday morning after seven weeks in an artificial coma, his club announced. "We're delighted that Boris's condition is getting better. He's on our mind every day," said manager Andreas Mueller in a statement.

The 22-year-old Vukcevic suffered severe head injuries in the collision on September 28 and was airlifted to hospital in Heidelberg, where he was operated on and put in an



## 'We have the belief to pull it off'

It was a day that illustrates why Test cricket is the premium form of entertainment in the sport; a day of ebb and flow seemingly leading the contest towards a stalemate, then all of a sudden changing directions through a passage of play that breathed such life into the match that a positive result for either West Indies or Bangladesh now seems the likeliest outcome.

In the last hour of the fourth day of the first Test at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur yesterday, it was Bangladesh who grabbed the bull by the horns, taking five wickets for 35 runs to leave the West Indies in a position of uncertainty. The visitors now lead by 215 with four wickets left -- one of them the crucial one of Shivnarine Chanderpaul, who was sidelined by illness and may or may not bat today.

From the home team's perspective, fans can be forgiven for waiting for the penny to drop. They are playing Tests after almost a year, and yet ran up their highest total ever, 556. They have rarely played two consecutive days of good Test cricket, yet finished the third and fourth days on top. Individual brilliance rather than collective competence has been the hallmark of their moderate Test successes, yet at the end of the fourth day the identity of the player sent to answer the media at the post-day conference was a cause for speculation.

Rubel Hossain had performed admirably, taking the wickets of Chris Gayle and Darren Bravo on what looks like a pacer's graveyard while Shohag Gazi and Shakib Al Hasan engineered West Indies' evening session collapse. In the end Nasir Hossain, whose swashbuckling 96 gave

## 'We still can win'

West Indian opener Kieron Powell had earlier stated that it was his aim to score a century against Bangladesh in this series, a task he achieved on the very first day of the Test match. The left-handed batsman's list of triumphs though wasn't going to stop there.

The batsman once again anchored the West Indian batting order and in the process scored his second century of the match.

"I was thinking about it last night and people I talked to told me that this was the perfect opportunity to do something like this. I am not too sure how often it happened but I am happy that it happened to me," said Powell after the fourth day's play of the first Test against Bangladesh at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium yesterday. Powell's 'century double' makes him a part of an elite group of West Indian batsmen, including the likes of Gordon Greenidge, to have scored two centuries in a match.

However, Powell's departure late in the day triggered a

## Set for an exciting finish

Bangladesh may rue some missed chances, but what they have so far achieved in the first Test against the West Indies many could not have envisioned in their dreams. First, Tamim Iqbal and Shakib Al Hasan missed their hundreds and then Nasir Hossain fell only four runs short of the magical three-digit figure on the fourth day. Then there were the two dropped catches by Junaed Siddiqui, but in the end it was another successful day for the Tigers after they finished their first innings with a record 556 runs and inflicted some telling damage to the West Indies second innings in the last hour of the fourth day at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur.

The match is set-up nicely after the fourth day with West Indies batting on a 215-run lead but with the loss of six wickets. There is hardly any batting left for the Caribbean side, especially as it is uncertain whether the ill

Shivnarine Chanderpaul will bat today, so a great finish on the final day is on the cards, with all four results possible.

Outstanding batting from the Tigers brought the fans to the ground in numbers on Friday, a public holiday and the way the game is poised, many may not miss the opportunity to watch a tense finish on the final day from the stands. Undoubtedly Mushfiquir Rahim's men have the edge over their opponents after end of the day's play following a late surge by left-arm spinner Shakib Al Hasan and off-spinner Shohag Gazi. Still they have a huge task left to make it a memorable Test match, especially as there were signs of the pitch starting to crumble in the last hour, which means talented West Indies spinner Sunil Narine may be a threat for the Tigers batsmen in the second innings.

The day had an exciting finish when West Indies slipped to 244 for six from the safety of 209 for one. A 189-run partnership between Kieran Powell (110), only the ninth Caribbean
