France midfielder Yann Mvila of Ligue 1 outfit Rennes will appeal his 18month international ban which rules him out of the 2014 World Cup finals, his lawyer told AFP on Friday.

"The decision to appeal was taken and a recorded delivery letter will be sent early next week," Mvila's lawyer Thierry Fillion said.

On November 8 five France under-21 players including Mvila picked up lengthy international bans (the others until December 31, 2013 and Mvila until July 14, 2014) as punishment for breaking a night-time curfew between two key European championship qualifiers.

Mvila, 22-years-old, already had 22 senior caps times but was with the Under-21's after being warned over future conduct when he refused to shake coach Laurent Blanc's hand when substituted during their quarterfinal defeat to Spain at Euro 2012.

The French Football Federation identified Mvila as the ringleader behind the ill-judged round-trip taxi-ride from the north coast port of Le Havre to a Champs Elysee nightspot in Paris.

The team had beaten Norway 1-0 the previous evening in a Euro 2013 play-off but suffered a heavy defeat at the hands of the Scandinavians 5-3 in the return.

France coach Erick Mombaerts was sacked after the loss.

The others were Rennes' Chris Mavinga, Wissam Ben Yedder of Toulouse, Real Sociedad's Antoine Griezmann and Mbaye Niang of AC Milan.

Robben breaks down again

Gunners blast Spurs Lille miss

Emmanuel Adebayor made a nightmare return to the Emirates Stadium on Saturday, his 18th-minute dismissal proving decisive as Arsenal cruised to a 5-2 win over

Tottenham Hotspur in the north London derby. The former Arsenal forward had already fired his side into a 10th-minute

lead when he jumped in on Gunners midfielder Santi Cazorla to earn a straight red card. That transformed the game, with

Arsenal establishing a two-goal half-time lead through Per Mertesacker, Lukas Podolski and Olivier Giroud. Cazorla and Theo Walcott added to the

tally after the break, with Gareth Bale claiming one back for the visitors. The result provided a timely boost for

Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger, who has come in for growing criticism following a string of inconsistent performances.

For Tottenham manager Andre Villas-Boas, there was only frustration, as he suffered an embarrassing reverse in his first experience of this local derby.

The Spurs manager's decision to pair Jermain Defoe and Adebayor up front for the first time in the Premier League this season confirmed the visitors' intention to take the game to Arsenal. And for the 17 minutes prior to

Adebayor's dismissal, the plan worked perfectly.

William Gallas had an eighth-minute effort ruled offside, but two minutes later the visitors went ahead when Jan Vertonghen's routine long ball forward exposed the Arsenal backline.

Mertesacker and Bacary Sagna were both caught sleeping as Defoe beat the offside trap before firing in a left-foot shot that Wojciech Szczesny could only palm into the path of Adebayor, who finished from four yards out.

It was the ideal start for the striker, but did nothing to calm him and eight minutes later, referee Howard Webb brandished a straight red card after he lunged in foolishly at Cazorla with his studs show-

The momentum of the game shifted completely, with Tottenham immediately forced onto the back foot as Arsenal made the most of being handed an unexpected route back into the game.

It took the home side just seven minutes to level, with Mertesacker making up for his earlier error by heading home Theo Walcott's right-wing cross.

This time it was the Spurs defence that was all at sea, with Gallas guilty of allowing the Germany centre-back to rise unchallenged.

Spurs defences were breached again two minutes before the break when Podolski cleverly used Mikel Arteta's run as a decoy before turning and shooting beyond Lloris with the help of a deflection off Gallas

Then, seconds before the interval, Arsenal well and truly took control when Giroud turned home Cazorla's left-wing

cross at the near post. Villas-Boas made two changes at half-time and switched to a back three in an effort to restore his side's attacking

threat.

But it was Arsenal who soon established their dominance once again and when Cazorla made 4-1 on the hour, it was impossible to see a way back for the visitors.

Walcott and Podolski combined on the left before the German drilled in a low cross that found Cazorla unmarked at the far post.

Lille missed the chance to move level on points with Ligue 1 pacesetters Paris St Germain and Olympique Marseille when their recent fine run ended with a 2-0 defeat at Lorient on Friday.

Lorient, who had conceded 16 times in their previous four matches, triumphed thanks to goals midway through each half from Gregory Bourillon and Benjamin Corgnet.

Lille, who had won their last three league games, stay seventh with 20 points from 13 games, three points behind leaders PSG.

Lorient, who kept only their second clean sheet of the season, move up a place to 10th with 18 points. PSG, who lead

Marseille on goal difference, take on in-form Stade Rennes at the Parc des Princes on Saturday. At the Moustoir, Lorient

went ahead in the 24th minute when defender Bourillon headed home from a Yann Jouffre free kick.

Lille came close to equalising early in the second half but Fabien Audard produced a great save to keep out Aurelien Chedjou's header.

Lionel Messi's season has ended with Argentina's national team. It's been quite Messi's transformation in 2012 was

remarkable. The man who couldn't score for his country suddenly equalled Gabriel Batistuta's 1998 record of 12 goals in a year. Messi needed only nine games, while Batistuta had 12. Messi has always scored for Barcelona,

but he only began to deliver for Argentina this year. Between March 2009 and October 2011, he failed to find the net in 16 matches: seven World Cup qualifiers, five at the World Cup, and four in Copa America, the continental championship. The criticism was unrelenting, with

reports suggesting he was either unpatriotic or unable to handle the enormous pressure placed on him in football-mad Argentina. Messi has clicked with Argentina coach

Alejandro Sabella, who took over 15 months ago after Sergio Batista was fired following the team's quarterfinal exit at Copa America. "Messi is capable of breaking all the

records, as incredible as that seems," Sabella said. "For a player like Messi, with his physical talent, football knowledge, technical ability - and his head - everything is possible."

Messi was overwhelming in 2012, pushing his career total for Argentina to 31 goals. He trails Diego Maradona by three. Next in line is Hernan Crespo with 50 and Batistuta with 56. It's possible - perhaps unlikely, but this is Messi - that he could break all of those records as soon as the Messi made it clear when Sabella took

over that he wanted to play with two forwards in front of him: Sergio Aguero and Gonzalo Higuain. Sabella obliged, and the player known as "La Pulga" (The Flea) delivered. In a season of many highlights for

Argentina, the apex was a 3-0 victory over Uruguay, the defending South American champion, in World Cup qualifying last month. Messi scored two goals and received repeated, thunderous ovations from a sellout crowd in the western city of Mendoza. The year was also marked by the birth

of Messi's first child, Thiago, born November 2 to his girlfriend Antonella Rocuzzo. The low point probably came a few

days ago in Argentina's 0-0 draw against Saudi Arabia in Riyadh. Messi played poorly, as did his teammates. They looked burned out, and the tone was probably set by Messi's arrival on Monday, when security guards were unable to control the chaos, with one soldier inadvertently pointing the barrel of a rifle at him.

Of course, Messi is also prospering with Barcelona.

He has scored 76 goals this calendar year for Barcelona, putting him only nine shy of Gerd Mueller's record set 40 years ago. He passed Pele's mark of 75 last weekend.

"At this point in history there is no longer any difference between what Messi delivers for Barcelona and what he produces for the national team," said Miguel Angel Bertolotto, a reporter with the daily newspaper Clarin. "With his unequalled play, he has shredded all doubts."
