

HALL-MARK LOAN SCAM ACC quizzes seven Janata Bank officials

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) yesterday quizzed seven Janata Bank officials, including its general manager (GM) and deputy general manager (DGM), in connection with the Hall-Mark loan scam.

A six-member ACC team interrogated the bank's officials regarding the loan's non-funded portion, ACC sources said. Non-funded loans are the loans which are taken in the form of guarantee against letter of credits (LCs) while funded loans are taken in cash.

The officials are GM Aminul Islam, DGM Joyntul Abedin, AGM Ruhul Amin, Manager Export Alauddin Akond, and Export-in-Charge Abdul Gafur of the bank's local branch in the capital's Motijheel area.

The other officials are senior executive officers AK Azad and MM Soebul Kabir of Elephant Road Branch.

ACC DD SMM Akhter Hamid Bhuiyan said the bank officials denied their involvement in the scam.

ACC Commissioner Mohammad Shahabuddin said they have almost completed inquiry into the non-funded loan of Tk 1,118 crore and involving 26 banks including Sonali and Janata.

Earlier, ACC completed its enquiry into the loan scam's funded portion of over Tk 1,568 crore and filed 11 cases last month.

According to a Bangladesh Bank report, Sonali Bank's Ruposhi Bangla Hotel branch gave loan of Tk 3,547 crore to Hall-Mark Group and five other companies defying banking rules.

Of the loan, Hall-Mark alone took Tk 2,686 crore.

COLLEGE GIRL'S SUICIDE

Nahid asks for punishment to stalker

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid yesterday visited the house of the college girl in Narayanganj who committed suicide on Saturday after a stalker allegedly harassed her on her way to college.

Farhana Islam Rimi was a second year Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) student of commerce group in Sonargaon Degree College of the district.

On that day, thirty-one-year-old Shamim waylaid Rimi, harassed her and snatched her mobile set. Rimi, after returning home killed herself by taking pesticide around 11:00am. Shamim has been on the run.

The education minister consoling the victim's family at Char Goadi village under Pirojpur asked the authorities to take action against the people responsible

for Rimi's death. The death, he said, cannot be termed suicide. It is a homicide as stalkers provoked her to take her own life.

These incidents will recur unless our attitude to women is changed, said Nahid adding that we have to respect women. Social movements should be launched to prevent this kind of incidents, he added.

Later, Nahid addressed the students of the college.

Local lawmaker Abdullah Al Kaiser, District Commissioner Monoj Kanti Boral and Upazila Nirbahi Officer Sagorika Nasrin accompanied him.

Meanwhile in the afternoon, the deceased was buried in the family graveyard.

A cousin of the victim, Habibur Rahman, filed a case under Women and Children Repression Prevention Act accusing Shamim yesterday.

Ex-DGFI chief visited Khaleda with 'minus-two' formula

Former DGFI director general Major Gen (retd) Sadik Hasan Rumi yesterday said he went to BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's Mainul Hossain Road residence in the capital on April 17, 2007 with the proposal of "minus-two" formula.

The formula proposes the removal of Khaleda and Awami League (AL) President Sheikh Hasina from politics.

He had gone to the residence as per the then chief of army staff Gen Moeen U Ahmed's order, said Rumi.

He was being cross-examined before a Dhaka court by the counsel for detained Harkatul Jihad al Islami leader Mufti Abdul Hannan, the prime accused in two cases filed over the August 21, 2004 grenade attacks on an AL rally in the capital's Bangabandhu Avenue.

Rumi said he did not oppress eminent lawyers and politicians during the last military-backed caretaker government but these took place without his knowledge.

EXPEDITING WAR CRIMES TRIAL Pro-AL lawyers for more tribunals

Pro-ruling party lawyers yesterday demanded that the government forms more tribunals to expedite the war crimes trial.

The trial is being held to establish the sense of humanity, not for any jealousy or revenge, said M Amir-UI Islam, convener of Sammilita Ainjibi Samannay Parishad (SASP).

He was presiding over a meeting organised by the SASP at the Supreme Court Bar Association's (SCBA) south hall in the capital yesterday protesting the attack on the law minister's escort car on November 13.

Awami League lawmaker Nurul Islam Sujan said those, who wanted to make Bangladesh an Afghanistan and were defeated in 1971, are trying to foil the ongoing trial by launching the secret attacks at the instigation of BNP.

SCBA Secretary Momtazuddin Ahmed Mehedi and SASP leader Subrata Chowdhury, among others, spoke.
