RMG workers block road

Govt forms probe committee

Hundreds of garment workers yesterday blocked Dhaka-Tangail highway on the capital's outskirts Ashulia demanding punishment for those responsible for Saturday's fire, which killed at least 111 of their fellow workers.

As the protest broke out, most of the garment units in Ashulia were declared closed for yesterday to avoid any untoward incident, police sources said.

Vehicular movement remained suspended for around three hours from 9:00am, said witnesses, as the protesters pelted masonry at some speeding vehicles and police men who put barricade at Bipile on the highway to hold back the workers. But no casualty was reported.

Earlier, the agitating workers staged protest in front of Tazreen Fashion Ltd in Ashulia, where the fire broke out.

Meanwhile, the home ministry formed a four-member committee on Sunday to investigate the incident.

The committee visited the spot yesterday and found that the factory had no emergency exit, which could reduce the

casualties.

Additional Secretary to Home Ministry Main Uddin Khandaker, who is heading the committee, told The Daily Star, "We are investigating whether the fire originated from an electric short circuit or it was an arson."

He said the victims died from suffocation in smoke as they could not move out of the building. The committee will submit its report and recommendations within 15 working days.

Ashulia police suspected the fire to be an arson and a sub-inspector of the police station filed a case on Sunday night against some unidentified persons on charge of setting fire to Tazreen Fashion Ltd. A team of Criminal Investigation Department (CID) along with forensic doctors of Dhaka Medical College Hospital yesterday collected samples from 57 unidentified bodies to find out their identities through DNA tests.

The 57 bodies will be buried at Jurain graveyard in the capital today. Anjuman Mufidul Islam, a voluntary organisation, will arrange the burial.

PRIMARY TERMINAL EXAM

Probe body finds no leakage of question paper

The probe committee formed to investigate the allegation of a question paper of primary terminal examinations 2012 to have been leaked did not find the allegation to be true.

The committee submitted its report to the Primary and Mass Education Secretary (in-charge) MM Neazuddin yesterday.

The ministry on November 22 formed the three-member committee headed by its Joint Secretary Gias Uddin Ahmed following reports of two newspapers that question paper for Bangla was leaked out in some areas of the capital.

Talking to journalists, Gias said some questions made by coaching centres in their model tests matched the main question paper partially and that is quite usual, he said.

The committee suggested formulating several sets of question papers and setting up a separate unit in the Bangladesh Government Press for printing the question paper.

The examination, considered the largest public exam in the country, began on November 21 with some 29 lakh students registering to sit for the exams.

The examination will end on November 29.

EC believes in complete transparency

CEC says at inaugural of electoral talks

Chief Election Commissioner Kazi Rakibuddin Ahmad yesterday said the current Election Commission believes in complete transparency and wants to conduct parliamentary elections with cooperation from all political parties.

He was speaking at the inaugural of electoral talks with political parties in the capital's National Economic Council.

"The election commission wants to hold free and fair elections abiding by all laws as it will strengthen the country's democracy further," he said.

The country's political parties did not get much time to strengthen democracy as undemocratic forces hampered the democratic process many times. "There-

fore, the country's democracy shall be taken forward through talks with political parties for fair elections," he said.

Four out of six political parties -- Islamic Front Bangladesh, Islami Andolon Bangladesh, Krishak Sramik Janata League and Bangladesher Samajtantrik Dal -- joined the talks separately.

Islami Oikya Jote, a component of BNP-led opposition alliance, and Oikyaboddha Nagorik Andolon did not join.

The political leaders spoke for deploying army in parliamentary polls and expediting the bifurcated Dhaka city corporation polls while some opposed using of electronic voting machines in parliamentary elections.

The EC will sit with another six registered political parties today.

Condolences pour in

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh expressed deep shock at the deaths of 111 workers in a devastating fire at a garment factory in Ashulia on November 24.

"I am deeply saddened at the loss of life...On behalf of the government of India, I express our sincerest condolences at this tragedy. Our thoughts and prayers are with the bereaved families," he said in a statement issued yesterday.

In a condolence message, Nobel Laureate Prof Muhammad Yunus said, "I implore all factory owners and the government authorities to take appropriate measures immediately to ensure that deaths like these do not happen in the future under any circumstances."

"I was shocked and saddened...On behalf of Her Majesty's Government, I extend our heartfelt sympathy to the people of Bangladesh," said UK's Senior Minister of State for Foreign Affairs Baroness Warsi in a statement, reports our UK correspondent.

The US Ambassador in Dhaka Dan Mozena and foreign diplomats also expressed condolence.

Manusher Jonno Foundation, Communist Party of Bangladesh, Bangladesh Workers Party, Bangladesh Socialist Party, Bikalpadhara Bangladesh, Ain o Salish Kendra, Bangladesh Trade Union Centre, Federation of Garment Workers, Federation of Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce, and Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers & Exporters Association demanded proper compensation for the victims' families.

RAILWAYGATE SCANDAL

ACC charges Suranjit's ex-APS

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) yesterday charged Omar Faruq Talukder, sacked assistant personal secretary (APS) to minister without portfolio Suranjit Sengupta, with illegally amassing wealth of Tk 1.47 crore.

Meantime, Omar Faruq yesterday morning surrendered before the two Dhaka courts of Metropolitan Magistrate Amit Kumar Dey and Metropolitan Sessions Judge (in charge) Dr Md Akhtaruazzaman for securing bail in the case, but he withdrew his bail petitions apprehending that the courts could reject his petitions and send him to jail.

SM Rashedur Rahman Reza, an ACC assistant director and investigation officer, submitted the charge sheet to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court in Dhaka.

In his charge sheet, the IO said Faruq also concealed the information of Tk 3,04,980 in his wealth statement submitted to the ACC.

The anti-graft watchdog filed the case against the key figure in the railwaygate scandal Omar Faruq on August 14, 2012.

According to the official of the Anti-Corruption Commission, Omar Faruq was sued on charge of earning around Tk 1.04 crore illegally.

On April 9, border guards arrested Omar Faruq and Yusuf Ali Mridha, the suspended general manager of Bangladesh Railway (eastern zone), at Pilkhana along with railway's Dhaka Divisional Security Commandant Enamul Huq and Ali Azam, driver of the microbus that was allegedly carrying Tk 70 lakh to Suranjit's Dhanmondi residence in the capital.
