floor, said they closed the shop on Monday night and found it robbed after opening it yesterday around 10:30am. Tuesday is observed as a weekly holiday by shops, markets and commercial

Eastern Plaza is situated. All the jewellery, except some light ones, have been stolen. However, the burglars did not damage anything, he sonnel were on duty, he said.

Kalabagan Police Station Officer-in-Charge Enamul Hoque said although the shop's doors and padlocks were intact, police found one square feet of its false ceiling open. Police suspect that the burglars entered through the gap.

SYNCHRONISED BOMB ATTACKS

10 yrs in prison

A Rajshahi court yesterday sentenced seven activists of banned militant outfit Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) to 10 years rigorous imprisonment in an August 17, 2005 synchronised bomb attacks case. Judge Ekramul Haque Chowdhury of the Speedy Trial

Tribunal also fined each Tk 10,000, in default to suffer another six months in jail.

JMB carried out the attacks in some 500 places across the country, including Rajshahi city. Afterwards, the aforementioned case was filed with Rajpara Police Station.

Of the convicts, Toriqul Islam, Shafiullah Tarek, Abu Isa and Johurul Islam have been arrested while Korban Ali, Enamul Hoque and Amanullah are on the run.

They were found guilty of exploding bombs on Rajshahi Judges Court premises, in front of Advocate Bar and Deputy Commissioner's office, and Laxmipur intersection.

Seven JMB men get | Hasina urges Khaleda not to save war criminals

Taking a swipe at the opposition leader for "trying to protect the war criminals," Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday urged Khaleda Zia to shun her "ill-efforts" to obstruct the war crimes trial. "You (Khaleda) had tried earlier to save

the killers of Bangabandhu, but couldn't, now you're trying to save the war criminals...don't try to do that because the people of Bangladesh won't accept that."

The prime minister told a public rally at Dhanbari Nawab Institution Ground organised by Awami League.

She alleged that it was Ziaur Rahman who had politically rehabilitated the war criminals after capturing power.

Hasina went on: "Khaleda, despite becoming a former premier, had whitened black money paying fine, even her sons

were engaged in corruption and siphoning off money abroad. But, we've brought back that money and those would be spent on curbing corruption as well as in its investigation...we'll bring back more money siphoned off earlier." Citing the recent fire incident in a gar-

ment factory in Ashulia that killed 111

people, Hasina said conspiracies are

being hatched when the country is moving forward. Various ill-attempts are underway to take Bangladesh backward, she alleged. In a scathing attack on BNP, Hasina said,

"Corruption and killing people are two big virtues of BNP." Earlier, the prime minister inaugurated

Dhanbari upazila complex, laid the foundation stone of Dhanbari Police station as well as a 50-bed upazila health complex.

Govt to amend disaster act Says JS body chief




