# RMG fire safety largely ignored

*Fire service teams begin countrywide inspection to find out ill-equipped factories*

The government yesterday launched a nationwide drive to identify readymade garment factories with dismal safety systems, five days into the nation's deadliest industrial blaze in Ashulia.

Fifteen teams from the fire service inspected 73 garment factories in Ashulia and found that one-third of the factories did not have sufficient fire safety measures and security for workers.

The issue of workers' safety in factories has come up strongly following the devastating fire that killed at least 111 workers at Tazreen Fashions in Ashulia on November 24.

It was found that the factory neither had any emergency exit nor adequate fire safety measures. And fire-fighting equipment on its different floors had not been used during the incident.

Moreover, the eight-storey factory had permission to have only three floors.

The teams comprising 70 officials would inspect as many factories as possible between November 29 and December 2, said M Abdus Salam, director of Fire Service and Civil Defence (administration and finance), who led the drive with the help of police.

**FIRE PANIC**  
100 hurt in another stampede

While the country has been reeling from the shock of Saturday's Ashulia fire, around 100 panic-stricken workers were injured in a stampede following a rumour of fire in two factories at Savar yesterday.

The rumour brewed when a fluorescent light sparked at the factory of Vision Apparel Ltd at Purba Rajeshwar area around 2:30pm.

Gripped by panic, workers on the first floor rushed downstairs

## INJURED IN FACTORY FIRE Caught in a loan trap

On Monday, Bablu sold the cow he had bought six months ago with the savings he and his wife had. The decision was tough but he had no choice.

Money is what Babul now badly needs to save his wife, Amela. A worker at Tazreen Fashions, Amela has had her right leg and some of her ribs crushed into pieces. It happened when she jumped from the second floor of the factory building to escape Saturday's fire.

Bablu first thought Amela was dead. So he searched for her body among the 111 bodies, some 60 of them burned to coal.

But two days after the incident he came to know from a friend that his wife was being treated at a clinic in Uttara.

Having borrowed Tk 2,400 from a neighbour at Nishchintapur in Ashulia, he rushed at once to the clinic and asked his parents (who live in Rangpur) to sell the cow. On Tuesday came Tk 12,000 from the sale.

Himself a furniture painter, Bablu got his wife released from the clinic

## 4 extortionists beaten to death

A mob beat four outlaws to death while they were fleeing after their failed attempt to collect illegal toll from a villager at Kaliani Beel area of Faridpur upazila in Pabna yesterday morning.

The deceased were identified as Mohammad Khalil, 25, a leader of Janajuddha faction of outlawed Purbo Banglar Communist Party, Liton Hossain, 22, and Akkas Ali, 26, its activists.

The identity of the other deceased could not be confirmed.

A gang of 10 to 12 led by Khalil went to the residence of Md Abul Kalam at Kaliani village at 8:00am to extort
