Boro on 1347 hectares in Teesta project area uncertain

Irrigation in 1,347 hectares of land in the upcoming boro season seems uncertain due to utterly bad condition of an 11.95-kilometrelong secondary canal under

Teesta Irrigation Project. The situation has arisen due to alleged irregularities in repair and maintenance of the important canal called S5D canal, originating from the Dinajpur main branch of Teesta Irrigation Project canal near Nilphamari bus terminal at Kalitola of Sadar upazila.

The secondary canal proceeds through Sutipara, Darwani, Joychondi, villages of Sadar upazila and

villages of Saidpur upazila with target to irrigate 1,347 hectares of land, said sources of Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB) in Nilphamari.

But adequate government fund for its maintenance and repair could not be arranged due to negligence of the officials concerned, said BWDB sources, adding that a scanty Tk 8 lakh was allocated for the purpose in 2001-2012 fiscal

Worse still, BWDB officials in Nilphamari diverted most of the money for other

"We got a fund of Tk 8 lakh for repair and renovation of Sonarai, Sangalshi S5D canal in 2011-2012. Khamatpara and Mazapara From this fund we diverted about Tk 5 lakh to build six Dhelapeer and Botlagari road barriers on the right

embankment of Dinajpur main branch canal to prevent movement of heavy vehicles," said Khairul Islam, sub divisional engineer of BWDB in Nilphamari.

Asked about the justification of diverting the fund while leaving irrigation in large areas uncertain due to inadequate repair of S5D canal, he could not give any satisfactory answer. The fund allocated for a


ment allocates money for its repair but most of it is wasted. In 2011-2012 fiscal year we saw some day labourers weeding out grass and bushes and fill some ditches or breaches with earth only for a few days as most of the money was "A few weeks ago I submitted a written petition to BWDB authorities in Nilphamari regarding the

matter as irrigation on 1347 hectares of land is uncertain this year due to bad condition of this canal," he said. Meanwhile, locals said the cost of setting road barriers would not exceed Tk 1.50 lakh as they were built with sub standard concrete with out using required quantity

During a visit to the canal on (November 25), this correspondent found that thick bushes and hedges covered the canal near the house of Deben Master at Joychondi village. Breaches and hedges were seen at Sonarai, Sangolshi, Khamatpara and Mazapara villages. Nearly the entire canal showed signs of vulnerability due to lack of proper repair and maintenance.

Most vulnerable point was seen at Songalshi breach stretching about ten feet at the 'right embankment' developed, making it almost impossible to arrange irrigation the next season.

Wife sues 26, most belonging to Jubo League: 3 held

Police till yesterday arrested only three of the accused in the case for killing of youth and sport secretary of district Awami League Sujanur Rahman Sujan.

On Friday night, Sujan's wife Monjuara Begum filed a case accusing 26 people, most belonging to Jubo League, in connection with the murder on Thursday.

According to the case statement, main accused Mostakim Rahman is a leader of Bogra town Jubo League. Another prominent accused is Delwar Hossen Hiro Possary, a former councillor of Bogra municipality and BNP leader.

The complainant stated

that Sujan was protesting the extortion by the accused in the area and being furious, the accused mercilessly hacked him to death.

She demanded exemplary punishment to the killers of her husband.


Investigation officer (IO) in the case and Inspector (Investigation) at Bogra

Saved from poachers, baby croc freed in the wild

A baby crocodile, allegedly brought from salt waters of Sundarbans canal by smugglers, was miraculously saved yesterday.

Forest department officials in a drive recovered the crocodile from a paddy field of Dhalir Ghope village in Sharankhola upazila in the morning.

Assistant Forest conservator of the Sundarbans East Zone Kashyap Bikash Chandra said, on secret information, a team raided

the village at about 7:00 am and recovered the four-footlong crocodile kept in a bamboo cage.

However, no one was arrested in this connection till filing of this report yesterday afternoon.

Later, the recovered crocodile was released at the crocodile breeding centre at Karomjal under Chadpai Range of the Sundarbans.

An organised gang has long been smuggling crocodiles out of the country after collecting those from various rivers canals and water bodies, sources said.

At least six crocodiles were recovered while being smuggled from the world's largest mangrove forest in the last one year.

In September last year, law enforcers seized four crocodile skins from a house at Uttar Kadamtala village. A case was also filed against six people.

Forest officials said that a smugglers' syndicate active at Sonatala village in the upazila, might have brought the baby crocodile on Friday night and hid it in the paddy field.

The authorities concerned are yet to take any steps to end the nearly three-monthlong deadlock at Islamic University (IU) in Kushtia.

The offices are open but they look desolate as teaches and most of the officials and employees have refrained from going to campus since September 8 due to the deadlock that followed controversy over appointment of 132 teachers and officials in the university on September 7.

Islamic University Teachers Association (IUTA) began agitation on September 8 demanding removal of the vice chancellor, pro-vice chancellor and treasurer for their alleged involvement in irregularities in the recruitment of the teachers and officials

Registrar office sources said Vice Chancellor Prof Alauddin left the campus on November 20, taking four days' leave. Pro-Vice Chancellor Prof Kamal Uddin has been on 13 days' leave since November 20 and Treasurer Prof Shahajahan Ali has remained absent since November 20. But they all came to the university on November 27 to appear before a three-member probe body and left the campus on the day.

Though Pro-Vice Chancellor Prof Kamal Uddin is supposed to rejoin office on

December 3, VC and treasurer did not come to the campus as of yesterday. When contacted over cellphone, VC Alauddin said he is in Dhaka on an emergency work. Treasurer Prof Shahajahan Ali declined to make any comment on the issue.

On the other hand, IUTA leaders yesterday urged the registrar not to send any file to the VC, Pro-VC and treasurer as the three what they said unwanted on the campus. As part of their agitation, they have been continuing sit-in in front of the administrative building since November 12.

Addressing a teachers' rally at the venue yesterday, IUTA President Prof Yakub Ali urged the government to take immediate steps to end the three-month-long deadlock at the university.

The rally was addressed, among others, by Islamic University Bangbandhu Parishad General Secretary Dr Ruhul Kuddus Saleh, IUTA General Secretary ASM Tariqul Islam, Prof Matiur Rahman, Prof Mahbubur Rahman, Prof Mizanur Rahman, and Dr

Baku Billah. They speakers demanded immediate appointment of honest and competent persons as new vice chancellor, pro-vice chancellor and treasurer, removing the present ones.
