Pace spearhead Dale Steyn rediscovered his best form to bowl South Africa into a commanding position on the second day of the third and final Test against Australia at the WACA Ground on Saturday.

Steyn's four-wicket haul helped decimate the Australian first innings and hand his side a 62-run lead, before Proteas batsmen Graeme Smith and Hashim Amla ripped the match away from the home side. Skipper Smith and Amla

shared in a thrilling 178run stand for the second wicket at almost seven runs an over as the tourists took a stranglehold on the top ranking in Test cricket. At stumps, South Africa

were 230 for two in their second innings, representing an overall lead of 292 runs with eight wickets left and three days still to play.

Amla was on 99 from just 84 balls with his 18th Test century beckoning, while Jacques Kallis, dropped on three by Nathan Lyon from the bowling of Mitchell Starc, was on 17.

# **Boxer Freddie** wins on debut

Andrew Flintoff will take his time before deciding if he will continue boxing after his successful heavyweight debut against American Richard Dawson.

The former England cricket captain beat Dawson 39-38 on points after a lively affair in front of 5,000 raucous fans at the Manchester Arena, but only after being knocked down in the second round of the four-round contest.

The 34-year-old said he will wait until after Christmas before deciding if he will continue his foray into the paid-ranks of boxing.

"I really enjoyed it. I said at the start that I knew I was starting at a novice level," said the former England allrounder, who sported a black eye in his post-fight news conference.

"I want some time off, have a nice Christmas. After Christmas I will star to decide what to do. It is quite fresh, still quite raw what happened." Flintoff had been

accused in some boxing quarters of demeaning the sport by thinking he could just casually walk into the professional ranks.

But that did not stop former England teammates, Matthew Hoggard and Steve Harmison, being at ringside to see the man who was twice an Ashes winner during his cricket career. Flintoff entered the ring

wearing the shirt of his county team, Lancashire.

But it was a walk very different to the one he used to make from the pavilion to the crease, this time the roped-off ring awaited him after Dawson had entered to a chorus of boos.

# MS's call 'immoral

Prabir Mukherjee, the Eden Gardens curator, has strongly criticised Mahendra Singh Dhoni's call for turning pitches, calling it "immoral", and even sought a month's leave from work.

However, by Saturday evening, the Cricket Association of Bengal (CAB) had convinced Mukherjee to come back to work.

The developments came less than a week before India's Kolkata Test against England, and days after the Board of Control for Cricket in India deployed Ashish Bhowmick, a member of its grounds and pitches committee from Tripura, to "assist" in the preparation for the Test that starts here on December 5. The series between India and England is tied at 1-

after India lost on a square turner in Mumbai, with their spinners taking nine wickets between them even as Monty Panesar and Graeme Swann shared 19. "Why does Dhoni want a square turner on the first

day? Then why are you selling tickets for five days? It's immoral," Mukherjee told CNN-IBN. Mukherjee said he didn't like the way the whole issue was handled. "I have not resigned but asked for a month's leave," he said. "I am not loving this atmosphere and not happy that the CAB did not support me."

Dhoni and Mukherjee have famously struggled to get along as professionals. Last year, after India beat England in an ODI in Kolkata, Dhoni said the pitch was an "ugly wicket".

Mukherjee then responded by saying, "Pitches don' score runs, batsmen do." It was also reported that Mukherjee had made disparaging comments about Dhoni's demands for specific pitches. He is reported to have asked for written official instruction if he was to prepare a pitch that began turning and bouncing on the first day.
