# ACC report next week

The enquiry team of the Anti-Corruption Commission will submit its report on the corruption allegations in the Padma bridge project next week after re-examining all documents, including those the World Bank had given the commission recently.

ACC Chairman Ghulam Rahman yesterday said the ACC will reinvestigate all corruption allegations in the project. "The enquiry team may submit its report to the commission next week," he said.

The enquiry team was supposed to submit its report to the commission during the WB external panel's stay in Dhaka between December 1 and 5. But the commission failed to finalise the report, as its meetings with the WB panel ended inconclusively.

Court asks IGP over producing detained judge before media

## Some provisions still not RPO-proper

Jamaat-e-Islami's charter still has some provisions not in conformity with the country's constitution and the Representation of People Order (RPO) even after the recent changes in it.

The party brought some changes in its charter recently and submitted it to the EC in efforts to meet the criteria for retaining registration with the commission.

But it still risks losing registration for those provisions which run counter to the country's constitution.

The RPO provides that a party shall not be qualified for getting registered with the EC if its objectives and any provision of its charter run counter to the country's


Faced with the EC's repeated pressure, Jamaat has deleted from its constitution the phrases "establishing just rule of Islam through organised efforts," and "bringing about necessary changes to the state system to ensure complete observance of Islam".

It has now replaced those with the phrases, "establishing just rule through democratic means".

Even the party's charter seems to have accepted parliament's plenary lawmaking power bestowed by the country's constitution by deleting the phrases "refuse to accept anyone except Allah as law-making authority".

## Deadly clashes erupt in Cairo

Tanks deployed after 5 killed, 450 injured

An elite Egyptian unit deployed tanks outside the presidential palace yesterday after a night of battles between Islamists and secular protesters that left five people dead and 450 wounded, spreading chaos in one of Cairo's wealthiest suburbs and leaving streets littered with debris and burned-out cars.

Angry mobs of Islamists battled the secular protesters with fists, rocks and firebombs in the first major outbreak of violence between political factions here since the revolt against the ousted president Hosni Mubarak began nearly two years ago.

With at least 12 tanks drawn up near the palace, troops from the presidential guard hammered stakes into the ground to string barbed wire to separate Islamists camping outside the palace and secular protesters chanting slogans urging the guardsmen to choose "between the revolutionaries and the killers."
