Maritime verdict creates new opportunity: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has extended her heartiest thanks to the UN for its Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS) saying the verdict of the UN body to resolve maritime dispute with Myanmar has created a new era of opportunity for Bangladesh to prosper.

She told a discussion on the Commemoration Ceremony of the 30th anniversary of the UNCLOS at Osmani Memorial Auditorium in the capital yesterday. The foreign affairs ministry organised the event.

She said the ocean related regulations are helping the countries establishing fundamental rules and principles to share maritime spaces and use the sea and its huge resources.

Referring to the peaceful settlement of the dispute with Myanmar on the maritime boundary in the UNCLOS, she said the resolution has given Bangladesh immense opportunity to explore the vast potentials of the sea for its economic progress.

The court passed the order when Monirul Islam, officer-in-charge of South Keraniganj Police Station and investigation officer (IO) in the abduction case, produced

Ameer before the court and sought a five-day further remand.

Monirul Islam stated in the remand prayer that he gathered important information about the abduction. The information derived from Ameer was being verified. So, Ameer needs to be remanded to get information from him about other culprits involved in the incident and to find out them, the IO added.

Ameer was arrested on November 24 in Tongi after a 'shootout' with Detective Branch of police when he sustained injuries. He was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

With Ameer, eleven people were detained in the case.

Parag Mondol, a six-year-old student of Heed International School, was abducted by criminals at Shuvadda Paschim Para in Keraniganj on November 11.

Parag was found three days after his abduction at Atibazar in the area.

Highlighting the plan to explore the maritime resources, she said her government has taken initiative for declaring a zone in the Bay of the Bengal as "Maritime Protected Area". The government also has taken steps for creating efficient manpower for research on maritime resources, she said.

She said the government has taken initiative for setting up an army camp in Cox's Bazar and construct an airbase for protection of the sea resources.

"Our seashore and off-shore areas are blessed with vast resources including salt, fisheries, natural beauties and valuable minerals. We have to protect the resources and ensure their proper utilisation for our development," she said.

Foreign Minister Dipu Moni, its Additional Secretary Khurshid Alam, Chairman of Bangladesh Law Commission Prof Shah Alam, Chairman of Petrobangla Prof M Hossain Monsur, UN Country Representative Neil Walker and acting secretary of the ministry Mostafa Kamal also spoke.

Ten Biranganas honoured

Biranganas yesterday asked the state to give them an allowance to help them lead their lives with some dignity.

They made the request at an event held at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy to honour their role in the Liberation War.

Ten Biranganas (women who were brutalised by the invading Pakistani army and their collaborators) are Suraiya Begum, Asia Akhter, Hajera Begum, Komola Begum, Nurjan Begum, Josna Begum, Raju Bala, Rahima Begum, Joydan and Shurjo Begum.

Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury, state minister for the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, presented the women with flowers and uttorio (celebratory scarves).

Raju Bala, who was only 14 during the time of the war, recalled the day on which she lost her husband, her child, her dignity and her will to live.

"When the military came, they locked my in-laws in one room and killed my husband in front of me. They dragged me and my baby fell from my arms. They stepped on my child with their boots and crushed him to death," she told the audience.

Shirin Sharmin said she would try her best to convince the government to create a comprehensive list of women affected during the war. That process might be long and difficult, but till then, the government can give an allowance to those who have already been identified, she said.

Chesta, an organisation working for the rehabilitation of Biranganas, organised the event. Poet Kazi Roby, among others, spoke.

Commerce Bangladesh, the Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Dhaka, the Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Bangladesh Employers' Federation and the Foreign Investors' Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

"We still remember the bleak days in the past when frequent hartals kept the economy at a standstill," they said in the statement.

Referring to the November 24 factory fire

that killed 111 garment workers in Ashulia, the business community said readymade garment buyers in North America began diverting export orders from Bangladesh to other countries after that unfortunate incident.

Furthermore, a consumer group's movement boycotting "Made in Bangladesh" products is taking shape.

The business community acknowledged that differences of opinions were inevitable in a functioning democracy but there were means to settle them other than through hartals and "politics of

damage and suppression".

The current political situation could be more people-friendly and business-friendly if the ruling and opposition parties demonstrated tolerance and were willing to settle issues through dialogues and negotiations, they said.

What the nation needs most now is a promise made by all political parties to uphold the country's interest first and refrain from activities that affect the economic growth and prospect, the statement says.

ENDOWED PROPERTY Cabinet okays draft law

The Cabinet yesterday approved in principle the draft of the Endowed Property Management Act-2012, a longstanding demand of the country's Hindu community, to prevent grabbing of such properties.

The law states that the handing over of such properties would be brought under a legal framework while a central management board would be constituted to look after the properties.

The vice chairman of the Hindu Buddha Christian Welfare Trust will be the chairman of the board while the post of a joint secretary-ranked administrator will be created. The latter will also act as the board's member secretary.

The board will also be formed at district level where the deputy commissioner will be the chair, Cabinet Secretary M Musharraf Hossain Bhuiyan told journalists after the weekly cabinet meeting at Bangladesh Secretariat.

The cabinet also endorsed signing of the supplementary protocol on the construction of Boundary Reference Marker in Naf River, along the Bangladesh-Myanmar boundary. This will make border dispute resolution easier, he said.

It okayed the proposal of extending the existing Agreement on Scientific and Technological Cooperation between Bangladesh and USA for another ten years till February 2023.

The cabinet adopted a felicitation motion on Bangladesh national cricket team's five-match ODI series win against West Indies and a condolence motion on Prof Khan Sarwar Murshid's death.
