Nation celebrates 41st anniversary of Liberation War victory today

With a vow to establishing a non-communal and prosperous Bangladesh imbued with the spirit of independence, different government and political, social and cultural organisations will celebrate today the country's 41st anniversary of victory in the Liberation War.

On this day in 1971, the nation emerged victorious from a nine-month-long hardfought war against the Pakistani occupation

People across the country and the Bangladesh missions abroad will celebrate the occasion by paying tributes to the three million martyrs for their supreme sacrifice, which eventually earned the nation the glory of independence.

The celebrations of this year's Victory Day call on the people, especially the young generation, to vow to bring positive changes to the nation with a hope of a prosperous Bangladesh.

On the occasion of the day, the capital city has taken a festive look with patriotic songs playing on loud speakers at different intersections and flags flying on cars of the general people, while many were seen draped in green

and red clothes matched to the National Flag. In separate messages, President Zillur

Leader of the Opposition Khaleda Zia have greeted the nation on the occasion. Today, a public holiday, will be heralded by 31 gun salutes at dawn at the National Parade Ground in the capital, while the Bangladesh

Rahman, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, and

flag will be hoisted atop government, semigovernment, and autonomous offices. The prime minister will place a wreath at the National Memorial in Savar at dawn followed by other political, social and cultural organisa-

tions and individuals. The army, navy, air force, BGB, police, Ansar-VDP and fire service will stage a special parade

at the National Parade Ground at 10:00am. Special prayers will be offered at mosques, temples, churches and other religious institutions seeking divine blessings for peace and progress of the country.

Bangladesh Television (BTV) and Bangladesh Betar along with private TV channels and radio stations will broadcast special programmes, and newspapers will publish special supplements on the occasion.

The cultural organisation, Utshe Bangladesh, has chalked out a three-day

programme titled "Bijoye Parbone" [the occasion of victory], which began yesterday on the central playground of Dhaka University.

Nine different organisations of Dhaka University students have organised three-day celebratory programmes at Teacher-Student Centre (TSC).

Meanwhile, at a protest rally yesterday, Information Minister Hasanul Haq Inu demanded banning the visit of collaborators of Jamaat-e-Islami to Shaheed Minar, the National Memorial, and the monuments for the martyred intellectuals.

To mark Victory Day, a dozen organisations held a number of programmes yesterday.

On the day in 1971, General AAK Niazi, who commanded the Pakistani occupation forces, surrendered with his 93,000 soldiers to the allied forces of Bangladeshi freedom fighters and Indian army at Suhrawardy Udyan in Dhaka.

Three million people sacrificed their lives for the freedom, while two lakh women fell victim to physical tortures, including rape, by the occupation forces and their local collaborators--Razakars, Al-Badar, and Al-Shams-during the war.

ABSENT DOCTORS Political link keeps them beyond law

Says NHRC chief STAFF CORRESPONDENT

No government action is taken against the 30 percent of doctors who remain absent from work because their political affiliation places them above the law, said National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) Chairman Mizanur Rahman yesterday.

The country's entire healthcare system is commercialised with the state only facilitating the process, he told a views exchange meeting organised by the Law Commission in the capital's Cirdap auditorium.

Discussants at the meeting stressed the need for enacting a law to combat negligence in healthcare and pointed out the hurdles to developing quality health services.

Emphasising the need for controlling the private practice of doctors, Barrister Misbah Uddin asked, "What would happen to the justice system if judges ran private practice in the evening?" The majority of barris-

ters, researchers, medical experts and other stakeholders at the meeting agreed that a law was necessary to prevent wrong diagnosis and doctors' negligence. However, Mizanur

Rahman said, "Not even capital punishment will put an end to their negligence unless there is a limit to the private practice by doctors."

On why the government hospitals are poorly maintained, he said doctors made more profit when fewer people went to government hospitals.

Victims of wrong diagnosis who filed cases against doctors placed their demands at the meeting, presided over by Law Commission Chairman Prof Dr M Shah Alam.


