

32 hurt as AL, BNP clash on V-Day

At least 32 activists of Awami League (AL) and Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) were injured in clashes during Victory Day celebration in Khagrachhari and Feni districts yesterday.

Our Khagrachhari correspondent reported that clashes between AL and BNP in Mohalchhari and Matiranga upazilas of the district left at least 22 activists from both sides injured.

Mohammad Jubayer, officer-in-charge of Mohalchhari Police Station, quoted witnesses as saying that the clash ensued as BNP men hurled brick chips at AL activists when they were passing by the local BNP office after placing wreaths at martyrs' memorial at the upazila headquarters at around 9:00am.

At least 10 activists from both parties were injured in the clash that continued for half an hour. Police rushed to the spot, dispersed the clashing groups and brought the situation under control.

Mohalchhari upazila BNP President Mohammad Hossain Babu alleged that the ruling party men swooped on their party men in a bid to foil their discussion on the Victory Day in front of the party office. At least seven BNP men were injured during the attack, he claimed.

Refuting the allegation, upazila AL General Secretary Ratan Shil said BNP men hurled brick chips at AL activists, prompting them to retaliate.

Of the injured, Fayezul Haque, 35, organising secretary of Mohalchhari Swechchasebok Dal, Juba Dal leader

Saddam Hossain, 25, Juba League leader Mohammad Masud were admitted to Khagrachhari Adhunik Sadar Hospital while the rest given first aid at the local health complex.

In Matiranga, at least 12 people sustained injuries as the ruling party activists clashed with BNP men in front of Gomoti Union Parishad office in the morning.

Of the injured, six are undergoing treatment at Khagrachhari Adhunik Sadar Hospital while the rest took first aid at the upazila health complex.

Locals said, the trouble began at around 9:00am when the activists of the two rival parties were placing wreaths at the martyrs' memorial in front of the UP office at around 9:00am.

Contacted, President of Gomoti Union BNP unit Abul Fazal Bhuiyan alleged that the ruling party men attacked the BNP men to foil their peaceful programme.

Gomoti Union Awami League President Monir Hossain refuted the allegation, saying that the incident occurred due to internal conflict of local BNP.

In Feni, BNP and AL activists clashed in the town and Sonagazi upazila over celebration of the Victory Day early yesterday, leaving at least 12 people from both sides injured, according to a correspondent.

Of the injured, six were admitted to hospitals in Feni and Chittagong while the rest given first aid at Feni Sadar hospital and Sonagazi Upazila Health Complex.

No case was filed with the police stations concerned in connection with the incidents as of 7:00pm yesterday.

ATTACK ON COPS IN CHUADANGA 8 Jamaat-Shibir men arrested, sent to jail

A court here on Saturday sent eight activists of Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami and its student front Islami Chhatra Shibir to jail.

They were arrested from Alamdanga and Jibonnagar upazilas on Friday and Saturday on charges of attacking policemen, vandalising and torching a fire service vehicle.

Assistant Superintendent of Police Nazmul Haque said, law enforcers arrested Jamaat leader Maulana Abdul Momin, 52, and activist Saiful Islam at Aylhashnagar village in Alamdanga upazila early

Saturday.

In another drive, police arrested Jamaat activist Abdur Rahman, 50, in Jibonnagar upazila at around 11:00am on the same day.

Five Shibir activists were arrested from Shapla-kolipara at Jibonnagar upazila headquarters and nearby Senerhuda village on Friday night.

The arrestees are Shariful, 32, Riyadh 18, Jobed Ali, 45, Ajibar, 48, and Jinarul Islam, 35.

Police on Saturday produced the Jamaat-Shibir men before a court that sent them to jail.

AL, BNP men lock in gunfight

At least five people were injured as two groups of AL and BNP activists locked in a gunfight in Ishwardi rail gate area on Saturday night.

Police and the locals said, the clash erupted after a group of BNP activists chased the ruling party men in the area at about 8:00pm. Both groups fired several rounds of bullets during the half an hour long gunfight, they said.

Officer in-charge of Ishwardi police station Md Akbar Hossain said, during the gunfight traffic sergeant Sohrab Hossain and one Alam Hossain were injured by bullets. They have been admitted to Pabna medical college hospital.

Locals and the OC said, two groups of AL and BNP men in the rail gate area were at loggerheads for long for control of the tempo stand there.

5 hurt as robbers explode bombs

At least five people were hurt as robbers exploded cocktails early Saturday in Birganj upazila of the district. The robbers also looted goods worth Tk 1 lakh.

Police said that a gang of 10 to 12 stormed into the house of Md. Abdur Rahman at Bhaduria village at around 1.30am. They took the family members hostage at gunpoint and looted valuables.

When the robbers were leaving, the family members raised a hue and cry.

The villagers rushed to the house and the robbers exploded three cocktails.

Krishak Dal leader bludgeoned by BCL

A Krishak Dal leader of Sharankhola upazila seriously injured in an attack by BCL activists yesterday morning.

Victim Selim Pahlwan, 45, was president of upazila unit of the BNP-backed party. He hailed from Uttar Tafalbari village under the upazila.

Witnesses said, a group of BCL activists led by Hasan Mir, member of upazila BCL executive committee, took Selim to local Rayanda Pilot High School.

Confining to a room of the school, they bludgeoned him, leaving him seriously injured.

Locals rescued him and

sent him to Upazila Health Complex. Later he was shifted to Khulna Medical College and Hospital.

In another incident, two madrasa teachers were injured in an attack in Moralganj upazila of the district yesterday morning.

A group of unruly attacked the teachers as they were standing by the roadside while a victory day procession, organised by local AL, was passing by them at about 11:00am.

Locals said Md Shorab Hossain Gazi, 45, and Khan Muttasim Billah, 37, of local Abu Huraira Dakhil Madrasa, were assaulted on suspicion of being Jamaat workers.

2 held with bombs in Chuadanga

Police arrested two people along with three bombs in Damurhuda upazila on Saturday night.

The arrestees were identified as Soheli Rana, son of Shahidul Islam, and Mahub Hossain, son of Abdul Wahed, of Darshana Islambazar area in the upazila.

Officer in-charge of Damurhuda police station Ahsan Habib said, Soheli and Mahub were moving suspiciously behind Ankur School, some 50 yards off

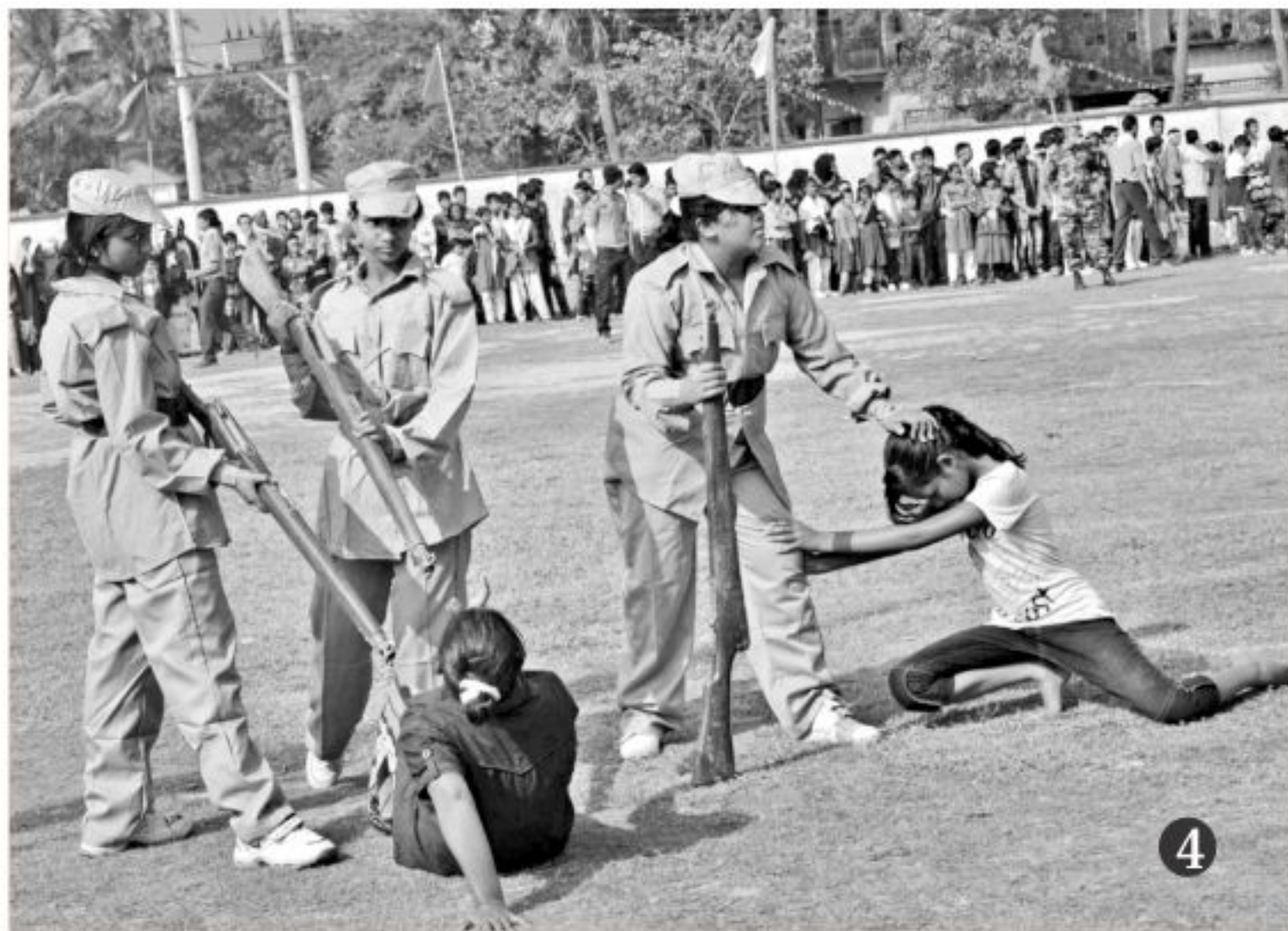
the office of local MP Haji Ali Asgar Tagar who was holding a meeting with his party activists there.

Locals challenged them suspecting their movement in the dark at about 10:30pm.

Later, they caught Soheli and Mahub when they found three bombs searching their bodies and handed them over to police.

Police suspected that the duo took position in the area with bombs in a bid to carry out subversive activities at the office of the lawmaker.

Drug addict youth jailed

Police said Jahangir used to torture his parents for money to buy drugs and vandalise furniture of the house. Jahangir was arrested with drug in his possession on Saturday after his father filed a written complaint with the police on Friday.

Land dispute kills woman

An elderly woman was killed and 10 others were injured in a clash between two rival groups over a piece of disputed land at Nobinagar village in Patgram upazila on Friday. Police arrested Dulal Islam, 48, Sohidor Rahman, 40, Wahidar Rahman, 44, and Karimon Begum, 38, of the village in this connection. The deceased was identified as Fatema Bewa, 67, wife of late Afsar Ali of the village. Police said, an altercation took place between the supporters of Bewa's son Abdul Jobbar and his uncle Abed Ali over the land at the village. At a stage, Bewa was beaten to death by the rival group when she tried to save her son.

30 houses gutted, five hurt

At least 30 dwelling houses were gutted and five received burn injuries on Saturday night in a devastating fire in Gabtola Goborchaka area in the city. Officer in-charge in Sonadanga model police station Quamruzzaman, quoting locals, said that the fire originated from a stove at a small restaurant at around 8.00pm and soon engulfed the adjacent houses. Four fire fighting units from Boyra with the help of local people extinguished the blaze after around one hour of frantic efforts.
