


Fellaini sorry for headbutt

Siddikur finishes well

Bangladesh golfer Siddikur Rahman finished his Iskandar Johor Open campaign in Malaysia strongly as he surged to joint 21st in the last round yesterday after starting the day on 59th. The rain-affected event was curtailed to a 54-stroke meet, and Siddikur put in his best performance in the third and final round, carding a five-under-par 67 for a cumulative score of six-under-par 210.

While Siddikur surged from just avoiding the cut to respectability, Spain's Sergio Garcia capped off a splendid tournament with an 11-under-par 61 to take the title with an overall score of 18-under-par 198, three clear of USA's Jonathan Moore in second place and four clear of Thailand's Thongchai Jaidee in third.

Arambagh pip Feni

Arambagh KS opened their account in their third match of the Grameenphone Bangladesh Premier League as they handed a 1-0 defeat to visitors Feni Soccer Club at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday. Nigerian hitman Abu Oludotun Paul struck the decisive goal in the 89th minute to give Arambagh all three points which put them on joint fifth place alongside Sheikh Russel, Team BJMC. Feni Soccer are at the bottom of the table along with

Brothers Union following three consecutive defeats.

Most of the first half of yesterday's match remained listless before Arambagh's Ugandan striker Idris Kasirye mustered the first shot on target in the 40th minute, but thanks to Feni goalkeeper Al Amin, the first half remained goalless.

Al Amin rescued his side again ten minutes into the second half as he confidently gripped a bicycle-kick from Osundo Maurice. Feni had the opportunity to break the deadlock in the 80th minute when striker Aminur Rahman Sajib found

Arambagh goalkeeper Mithun Hasan in a one-on-one situation, but his shot went over the crosspiece.

When it seemed that the match was heading for a draw, Arambagh's Nigerian striker Paul struck the crucial blow by heading home a Nche Francis cross, with one minute of regulation time remaining.

Feni Soccer could have snatched a point though had Sajib not spurned another easy chance in the stoppage time, but his failure meant Feni stayed at the bottom of the pile, staring relegation in the face.

All to play for on final day

A desperate India's push for a series-leveelling win was met with dogged resistance from England who rode on Jonathan Trott's gritty half-century to overcome a nervous phase as the fourth and final Test seemed headed for a draw on Sunday.

India batted for one hour in the morning before declaring their first innings at 326 for nine, four runs behind England, but could not make sufficient inroads as England reached 161 for three at close of an absorbing fourth day's play.

The hosts needed quick wickets but the fourth day track at the VCA Stadium did not show any signs of deterioration as

England batted out the day without seeming to be under any major discomfort.

Trott (66) and Ian Bell (24) were batting at stumps, with England having an overall lead of 165 runs.

With just one day left in the game, a draw appears to be the likely result though all four outcomes -- an Indian win, England win, tie and a draw -- can still be possible.

India will need to dismiss England as quickly as possible on Monday and score the required runs to entertain hopes of a series-leveelling win. England will be quite content with a draw which would be enough to give them their first Test series triumph on Indian soil in 28 years. The David Gower-led England team had last won a series in 1984-85.

Two crucial fixtures of the Grameenphone Bangladesh Premier League take place today at the Bangabandhu National Stadium with Sheikh Russel KC taking on last season's runners-up Muktijoddha Sangsad in the first match and Muktijoddha Sangsad in the first match and Mohammedan SC playing against Team BJMC in the latter.

Federation Cup champions Sheikh Russel, comprising nine national players, got the first jolt in their bid for the maiden professional league title after suffering a 3-1
