A schoolgirl allegedly committed suicide by hanging herself from the ceiling fan of her room in the capital's Rampura yesterday.

Alo Akhter, 10, was a third grader.

Fazlur Rahman, victim's uncle, said Alo's elder sister rebuked her and went for college.

Later, as Alo was not responding from her room, her parents broke open the door and found her hanging.

# Foolproof security for ICT demanded

The government must ensure foolproof security for International Crimes Tribunals (ICT) and persons working with it to save the tribunals, demanded Ekatturer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee yesterday.

The committee, also known as Forum for Secular Bangladesh & Trial of War Criminals of 1971, placed a five-point demand, including stern action against persons involved in leaking the Skype conversation of Justice Md Nizamul Huq.

On December 11, ICT-1 Chairman Justice Huq resigned amid controversy after Bangla daily Amar Desh published "transcript of Skype conversation" of Justice Huq with expatriate law expert Ahmed Ziauddin. The newspaper said it had collected the records of the conversation from a source abroad.

At a press conference in Dhaka Reporters Unity yesterday, the committee Adviser Justice Syed Amirul Islam said legal steps could be taken against persons involved in the hacking of Justice Huq's Skype account. He said, according to Information and

Technology Act-2006, a person found

involved in hacking into someone's computer and then leaking personal information could be awarded 10 years' imprisonment or fined Tk 1 crore.

The committee Acting President Shahriar Kabir called upon the govern-

ment to incorporate tougher penalties by amending existing laws so that none dares to hack into Skype or e-mail accounts. The committee Vice-President Muntassir Mamoon called upon the gov-

Muntassir Mamoon called upon the government to include provisions of capital punishment in the act if hackers threatened the country's security. "We are yet not certain if the Amar

"We are yet not certain if the Amar Desh authority itself was engaged in the hacking or got it from someone else. But getting or buying the Skype conversation is like buying a stolen material," he said.

#### Opposition's Mass Contact Khaleda to join 6 rallies in capital tomorrow

Kalam Azad, former deputy director of the RMCH; Matiur Rahman, proprietor of Rajshahi based Fahim Medical Ltd; Anisur Rahman, regional manager of Square Pharmaceuticals Ltd; MA Mannan, regional sales manager of The ACME Laboratories Ltd; Robiul Hossain, manager operations of Rajshahi depot of Renata Ltd; Shahidul Alam, senior regional manager of Jayson Pharmaceuticals Ltd; and Sheikh Mohammad Ali, regional

sales manager of ACI Ltd.
ACC Deputy Director
Manjur Morshed filed the
case with Rajpara Police
Station in Rajshahi city.

According to the case statement, the former RMCH director in connivance with the other accused embezzled Tk 2.13 crore out of Tk 5.70 crore fund for purchasing medicines.

The accused persons misappropriated the money by purchasing medicines from low-profile companies that offered the highest prices for the medicines and the accused persons avoided lowest bids of big companies.

The drug companies illegally withdrew their bids in the tender process making way for the RMCH to choose the highest bidder, Fahim Medical Ltd.

### Schoolmate's two sisters sued

A case was filed yesterday against two sisters of schoolboy Rony for pushing his schoolmate Sadia Akhter Pinky into committing suicide.

Threatened by the two with dire consequences if an abduction case against them was not withdrawn, 15-year-old Pinky took her life on Sunday at her grand-mother's residence in the capital's Manda.

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid yesterday visited the residence and assured the family members of bringing to book the accused. The schoolgirl was buried in Sonargaon of Narayanganj yesterday after an autopsy at Dhaka Medical College (DMC), which confirmed that she committed suicide, said DMC sources.

A junior school certificate examinee at a Jatrabari school, Pinky was abducted by Rony on November 28.


Four days later, police rescued her from a house in Araihazar of Narayanganj, and arrested Rony from the spot and later his sister Pakhi in an abduction case. Pakhi had attained bail. Pinky's father Babul Hossain told The Daily Star that his daughter took her life failing to stand humiliation and threat by Rony's sisters.

### CCC health workers demand arrear wages

Staff of Urban Primary Health Care Project in the port city yesterday staged a demonstration before Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) building, demanding payment of their arrear wages.

Under the banner of "Nagar Shastho Kendro Karmakorta Karmachari Kallyan Parishad," around 500 workers of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) project, which was being operated by CCC since 2001, took part in the hour-long demonstration from 10:30am.

The workers said they did not get any salary since September this year and were apprehensive about the future of the project and their jobs.

The project tenure ended in June this year, following which ADB extended the tenure till December 31.

Meanwhile, CCC Secretary Md Shamsuddoha told The Daily Star that the city corporation has decided to use its own funds to pay off the due salary of the project's staff in two phases in January and February respectively.

The decision came at a meeting called by CCC Mayor M Monjur Alam with the leaders of the Parishad following the demonstration.

Shamsuddoha said due to some problems in the extended period of the project, salary payments from ADB has been pending for three months.

CCC sources said if ADB does not provide fund for the next phase, the city corporation would run the project on its own.
