INDO-PAK SERIES Bomb squads, sniffer dogs comb venue

Police bomb squad officers and sniffer dogs combed Bangalore stadium Monday as part of a massive security operation for the start of the first Pakistan cricket tour to India for five years. Hardline Indian nationalist organisations including Vishwa Hindu Parishad and the Shiv Sena have both threatened to hold protests outside all the venues for the five-match series which begins here on Tuesday evening.

Thousands of Pakistani fans have been allowed to travel to India for the series -- the first since the 2008 Mumbai attacks which led to a complete breakdown in relations between the two countries.

returns to Pakistan soon so that our people can also enjoy watching us play against others on home turf," Hafeez noted.

Noting that T20s and one-dayers were pressure games, especially when playing against India, he said Pakistan was looking forward to an exciting contest ahead with a good combination of pacers, spin bowlers and in form batsmen and fielders.

"As we have a mixture of new, young and seasoned players, we are confident of taking on the Indian team, which is quite strong in both versions [T20 & ODIs] and has the advantage of playing on the home ground," the skipper said.

On being pitted against an experienced Indian captain (MS Dhoni) in handling pressure and facing mind games, Hafeez said he was confident of playing well despite pressure as the team had come well prepared with a strat-

egy to win matches and entertain the spectators in both the countries.

"No doubt Dhoni is far more experienced captain than me and Misbah-ul Haq [Pakistan's Test captain]. Every captain has his own challenges and strategies to execute. Our strategy is to play to our potential and do our best to win without worrying about the pressure that builds up in every game of the shorter version, especially in 20 overs format," Hafeez said.

The 32-year-old right-hand opener-cum-right-arm offspin bowler returned to the team in 2010 after being out of side since 2006 owing to poor form with the bat.

"It has been a learning process for me when I was out of the team for some time. I have worked hard to regain form and score runs consistently in both forms of the game. I am now confident of doing more with the bat and ball," Hafeez quipped.

He taught us humility: MS Sachin the greatest batsman of this era, say the Ws

It's not only the nuances of the game but also the quality to treat success and failure equally which the young India cricketers learnt from Sachin Tendulkar, skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni said on Monday.

Tendulkar quit one-day cricket on Sunday but will continue to play Test matches.

"As youngsters we got to see how Sachin prepared himself for each and every game and at the same time he showed us how to be humble in life and digest success and defeat, which is one of the most difficult things to do. All the way he guided each one of us," Dhoni told reporters in Bangalore.

Dhoni said it is disappointing that people won't see the 50th century in the coloured clothing and 100 half-centuries as Tendulkar finished with 49 tons and 96 fifties.

"That's something we'll definitely miss. But I think he has been an inspiration, encouraging thousands and millions of people to take up the sport and made us learn a lot of things about cricket," he said.

Dhoni said he learnt a lot about the game when he batted with him in

the ODI format.

"He told us which bowlers we can target and what should be the target in next four to five overs and things like that. This helped me learn a lot from him. Sachin's contribution is immense and definitely India will miss him," Dhoni said.

Replying to a question, Dhoni said Tendulkar is irreplaceable because of his unmatched batting skills and immense experience.

AFP adds from Karachi, famed Pakistan pace duo Wasim Akram and Waqar Younis Monday paid rich tribute to the Indian batting maestro, labelling him "the greatest batsman of this era".

Tendulkar, 39, announced his retirement from one-day internationals on Sunday after scoring 18,426 runs in 463 matches with 49 centuries -- all three world records for most runs, matches and hundreds.

"I don't say that a batsman like him will not come but he was the greatest batsman of this era and to maintain the zeal and fitness for 23 years was a big achievement for him," said Waqar, who retired in 2004.

"I also feel proud that I played against him and found him a great player and a nice gentleman."

Taylor-made Kiwi win

Advice from former captain Ross Taylor helped Martin Guptill to hit a thrilling century and clinch a last-ball, eight-wicket victory for New Zealand in the second Twenty20 International against South Africa at Buffalo Park on Sunday.

Guptill finished with 101 not out off 69 balls, hitting the last ball of the match from Rory Kleinveldt over cover for four to enable New Zealand to reach a target of 169 in a match reduced to 19 overs a side because of a floodlight failure.

The result enabled New Zealand to level the three-match series with the decider to be played in Port Elizabeth on Wednesday.

(Mushfiquur Rahman Mohan) on my behalf how he can claim to have cleared my dues?" said Mushfiquur when his attention was drawn to Duronto Rajshahi owner Mushfiquur Rahman Mohan's claim that they not only cleared the dues but also gave more than that.

Former BPL governing council chairman Gazi Ashraf Hossain however said that the Duronto Rajshahi owner's claim was right if they paid \$ 110,000 to Bangladesh skipper Mushfiquur.

"Initially it was decided that an icon player will get five percent more than the highest paid player in the team but later we changed it on request of the franchisees and it was decided that an icon player will receive 110,000 dollars. This decision was taken under the prevailing circumstances at the time," said Gazi Ashraf.

"We also conveyed this decision to our icon players. I personally talked with Mushfiquur Rahim regarding the revised amount," he added.

Mushfiquur however demanded the amount based on Nasir Hossain's amount, who was the highest paid player in the team.

There has however been a number of other local players who are still wait-

ing for their dues and they are looking forward to December 31, the latest in a long line of payment deadlines.

Gazi Ashraf however said that the time has come for BCB to set a strong code of conduct for the players.

"I think the time has come for BCB to set a strong code of conduct for the players so we can avoid this kind of talking," said Gazi Ashraf, the member of the board's ad-hoc committee.

Blackout once more

AFP, New Delhi

Pakistan's first cricket tour to India in five years faced a media blackout Monday after international news agencies, including AFP, suspended coverage over a decision to bar their photo counterparts.

News outlets said they would not be filing any text or pictures after the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) refused to accredit the international picture agencies Getty Images and Action Images as well as two Indian agencies.

The five-match series is due to start on Tuesday with a Twenty20 International in Bangalore.

"It is regrettable that the politically-charged Pakistan tour will be affected by the BCCI's failure to recognise the long-standing importance of photographic news agencies in the flow of sport and news images every day," said the News Media Coalition, which represents a group of media organisations including AFP.

Other international agencies who are members of the coalition, such as Thomson Reuters and the Associated Press, will also halt text and photo coverage.
