BNP believes in open discussion

Says Khaleda

BNP does not believe in any backdoor dialogues rather it demands open discussions only on reinstatement of a nonpartisan government system to hold credible parliamentary elections, said BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia last night.

Elections under the Awami League-led government will not be credible or fair, she told some Awami League defectors at BNP's Gulshan office in the capital.

BNP, through a movement, will compel the government to amend the constitution to reintroduce the system and her party has no problem if the present government completes its full tenure, she said.

Blogs for govt officials mulled

The government is planning to introduce departmental blog, an online platform, under its different ministries to enable information sharing and interaction among officials from lower to upper tier of the administration with an aim to get solutions to various issues, said officials of Access to Information (A2I) Programme.

They said the departmental blogs of the Ministries of Health and Population Welfare; Social Welfare; and Women and Children Affairs have already been developed by A2I Programme and are now on test run.

The same blog would be replicated for other ministries after successful completion of the test run, they added.

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Secretary and National Project Director Md Nazrul Islam Khan said all officials and employees would be soon using the blogs for writing about various issues, making their respective websites virtual networks of interactive communication.

The blogs are being designed following the model of the Union Information Service Centre (UISC) that has emerged as an effective platform to troubleshoot various types of issues, including technical, official, socio- economic and employment issues, he said.

Nazrul said currently more than 10,000 entrepreneurs of different UISCs and officials of government are regularly writing for the blogs, offering the public necessary

information and solutions to various issues. A2I Local Development Expert Manik Mahmud said different ministries and departments could post notices and annual reports on their respective online blogs to share with others that would save both time and money of the government.

8 die in road crashes

Eight people were killed and seven others injured in separate road accidents in the capital, Mymensingh, Dinajpur, Jhenidah, Keraniganj and Netrakona yesterday.

Our staff correspondent reports, a woman was killed after the rickshaw she was traveling in was hit from behind by a bus, Brother Paribahan, in Lalbagh area of Dhaka around 4:30pm.

The deceased is Kawsari Begum, 40, wife of Anwar Hossain, a resident of Jinjira in Keranigang area. Protesting the accident, several hundred

people blocked the road and set the bus on fire, causing heavy traffic jam in the area. No one was hurt in the aftermath. The road was freed after an hour.

Monjur Rahman, 34, an NGO worker, died after a truck rammed his motorbike on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway at Mashkanda in Mymensingh around 11:00am.

Meanwhile, on Zila School Road in the district town, Nadira Jahan, 30, wife of Azhar Ali of Shankipara area was killed in an accident.

The incident occurred when Nadira got off an auto-rickshaw but fell down due to the pull of her cloth that was stuck with the wheel and the vehicle started rolling over her.

She died at Mymensingh Medical College and Hospital around 1:30pm. Our Dinajpur correspondent reports, a

6 held for killing Ctg student

Six people including a woman were arrested yesterday on charges of murdering Saidul Islam, a student of Chittagong Polytechnic Institute in the port city.

The six are "professional muggers" who were released on bail about four months ago, Inspector (Investigation) Sadip Kumar Das of Kotwali Police Station yesterday told The Daily Star. The arrestees are Delwar Hossain, 27, his wife Reshma

Begum, 22, Mamunur Rahman, 22, Akhter Hossain, 23, Monir Hossain, 28, and Jahirul Islam, 38. Police made the arrests early yesterday at Burma

Colony in Bayazid area. Saidul Islam was stabbed by Akhter during a mugging

on December 31 last year when Saidul caught hold of their team leader Delwar, Md Kamruzzaman, investigation officer of the murder case, quoted three of the arrestees as saying.

The inspector said Reshma was arrested as she tried to hide evidence and had been involved in several mugging activities.

Police seized a mobile phone that belonged to Saidul, two knives, a toy pistol and a CNG-run auto-rickshaw, which Jahirul drove on the night of the incident, Sadip added.

Saidul, 25, was a fourth-year student of the electrical engineering department and the lead guitarist of a local band named "Chhuti". He was attacked on a road at Mehedibagh near his

Doctors have asked police, visitors and relatives of the victimnot to ask her any question on the heinous incident or discuss anything related to that in front of her.

"She can talk now. But forced-recalling can lead her to grave mental illness or shock," said Bilkis Begum, member of the sevenperson medical team for the victim, and also the coordinator of One-Stop Crisis Centre (OCC) at DMCH.

She said, "It is better to wait, perhaps a few more days, until she starts talking about the incident. Now, she needs counselling to regain a steady mind.'

Meanwhile, students, people of victim's village and different non-government organisations brought out processions and formed human chains at different places in Tangail demanding exemplary punishment to the culprits. They gave memorandums to the Tangail Deputy

Commissioner. Four brutes raped the 15year-old girl confining her to a room for five days December 6 to 10 last year, in Madhupur of Tangail. Since, the girl lost her men-

tal balance. Police yesterday visited the place of the occurrence house of Nuruzzaman at Bokarabaid village -- and talked with locals.

managing director of the Grameen Bank on March 2, 2011 and Dhaka's poor handling of some human and labour rights concerns.

In the recent months, Hasina's government has cold shouldered some of the US officials during their visits to Bangladesh. In the latest example, visiting US state department official Robert Blake failed to make a call-on with the prime minister despite requests from the US embassy.

While on the other hand, ties with countries like Russia, China, Japan and European countries have improved greatly. However, relations with Germany deteriorated after the government had summoned its diplomat and protested German foreign minister's remarks during his visit to Bangladesh last June.

Critics say the government has utterly failed to prove its skill and efficiency in negotiations and protecting the interest of Bangladesh while dealing

with bilateral issues with neighbouring countries, especially with India, as the common feeling is Bangladesh gave much more than India did to Bangladesh.

Besides, the government could not convince Myanmar, Bhutan or Nepal of exporting hydroelectricity to meet the shortage in Bangladesh, and had to be satisfied with mere assur-

With Myanmar, the longstanding issue of repatriation of Rohingya refugees still remains unresolved. The Myanmar president, who was scheduled to visit Bangladesh in July, last year, first cancelled the tour and now it has become totally uncertain.

Rather, the government was severely criticised when it totally ignored international calls to allow Rohingyas into Bangladesh during last year's sectarian violence in Myanmar.

Dhaka's relations with Islamabad has plunged into all-time low since the

Awami League-led grand alliance came to power four years ago, mainly on the issue of the genocide the then Pakistani troops had carried out during Bangladesh's War of Liberation in 1971.

Despite volatile Middle Eastern political situation as well as economic recession, and some restrictions in UAE and Saudi Arabia, Bangladesh's manpower export to several countries has increased mainly in the last two years. This year it marked a growth by 11 percent from the previous year.

Meanwhile, the remittance in 2012 is expected to hit US\$14 billion whereas it was \$ 12.17 billion in 2011. Last year's remittance was considered as the preceding decade's highest.

A diplomatic tension has been created with Turkey over the Turkish president's letter to Bangladesh government calling for clemency to the accused of war crimes, and the visit by an NGO delegation misusing on arrival visa facility.

In the last four years, the Awami League government had made a considerable number of attempts to reach different nations. But all in all, it appeared to be very India centric.

Critics say the last four years of Hasina-led grand alliance government witnessed a monotonous performance because of excessive visits by the PM herself and her Foreign Minister Dipu Moni, as they hardly miss any foreign trip.

They said the government had achieved some degree of success in multilateral diplomacy, but it has a very few success stories to pursue its agenda through bilateral diplomacy. On some vital issues, the

foreign minister failed to remove jolt while Prime Minister's International Affairs Adviser Gowher Rizvi played a vital role in various bilateral settlements, especially with India and the US.

In multilateral level, Bangladesh was elected to different important bodies under the UN systems,

including UN Human Rights Council and the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women.

The UN also unanimously adopted Sheikh Hasina's peace model. Bangladesh has also successfully projected its vulnerability to global warming at different international forums and continued to earn respect for its contribution to the UN Peacekeeping Missions.

One of the biggest successes of Bangladesh was the verdict in the International Tribunal of the Law of Sea (ITLOS), through which it settled the more than three-decade-old dispute with Myanmar on maritime boundary. On March 14, 2012, Bangladesh won the landmark verdict at ITLOS, as the tribunal rejecting Myanmar's claim sustained Bangladesh's claim to 200-nautical-mile exclusive economic and territorial rights in the Bay of Bengal.
