SEVERE COLD SPELL SWEEPS COUNTRY

Two housewives murdered, another tortured

Two housewives have been killed in Barisal and Khulna districts while another severely tortured in Narail.

A mother of a baby girl was beaten to death allegedly by her in-laws for dowry at Baushia village in Hizla upazila of Barisal early Monday.

The deceased was identified as Maksuda Begum, 22, wife of Monir Hossain Rari and daughter of late Kader Gazi of Baherchar village.

Police arrested Monir and his father Shafi Rari in this connection, reports our correspondent.

Md Nurul Islam, officer in-charge at Hizla police station, said Monir and his family members started to torture Maksuda for Tk 50,000 after three years of

their marriage. On the fateful day, Maksuda became unconscious after she was beaten up by her in-laws mercilessly following an altercation over

the issue. Hearing the hue and cry, neighbours rushed in and sent her to the upazila health in-law Mostafij Mollah

declared her dead. recovered the body and sent it to Barisal Sher-e-Bangla Hospital morgue for

On information, police Medical College and autopsy. A murder case was filed, said the OC.

wife was found murdered at Naihati village in Rupsha upazila on Monday morning, reports a correspon-

dent.

Begum, 35, was wife of Abdul Gafur of the village. She is survived by her two sons and two daughters.

Ashraf Hossain, officer incharge at Rupsha police station, said on information, they recovered Khairun's body from a banana orchard, a few yards away from her house, at around 10:00am.

The body was sent to Khulna Medical College and Hospital morgue for autopsy.

The woman might have been killed by her relatives over a piece of disputed land, said the OC.

In Narail, a woman who was seriously injured by her in-laws on December 26, is fighting for life at Lohagara upazila health complex, reports our correspondent.

The victim was identified as Sanjida Akter Rima, 26, wife of Billal Mollah of Talbaria village.

Rima said she worked at the paddy field of her husband as Billal went to Dhaka for earning livelihood.

"Her father-in-law Marjan Mollah and brothercomplex where the doctors attacked me with iron rod, leaving me seriously injured following an altercation over harvesting paddy at the field on December 26", said the victim.

On information, police rescued Rima from the spot and sent her to the Away in Khulna, a house- health complex, said Akram Hossain, officer incharge at Lohagara police

station. Rima's mother filed a case in this connection, said The deceased, Khairun the OC.

Smuggled low quality tea floods Jessore markets

Low quality tea smuggled from India is flooding the markets of the district.

The locally produced tea brands are being elbowed out gradually due to the aggression of the Indian tea, traders said. A syndicate of Indian smugglers in collu-

sion with its local accomplices are bringing in the low quality tea from the neighbouring country, they said. Smuggling of the inferior quality tea by the syndicate goes on unhindered through

different border points, threatening local tea industry. According to experts, such inferior qual-

ity tea which is being marketed without examining its standard, is also unsafe for public health.

To earn more profit, tea stall owners are using the tea which is cheaper than the local brands, endangering health of the consumers, locals said.

The low quality tea, often found dateexpired, is also available in the markets of Khulna, Jhenidah and Kushtia districts.

Sources linked to tea trading said that poor Indian tea intruded into local markets, mainly due to lack of monitoring by the Bangladesh Tea Board. The inferior quality tea is destroying the

market of the export-oriented Bangladeshi tea, they said. Bangladesh Standard Testing Institute,

which is responsible for monitoring standard of such products, also seems indifferent to the matter.

The Indian tea is coming to Bangladesh through road and rail routes.

During a recent visit, this correspondent found that Bangladesh Tea Board-approved different brands of tea like Vanston CD, Rajghat CD, Balishira, Amrail, Mirzapore, Rashidpur, Uttarbagh, Malnichira etc. have high demand in the local markets.

The local brands of tea are selling at prices ranging from Tk 160 to Tk 250 per kilogram. The smuggled Indian tea is selling at Tk

180 to Tk 200 per kilogram. Local tea traders said if they were given license, the low quality Indian tea could not capture the bordering markets in Bangladesh.
