

Zaka sounds out another warning

The already uncertain situation regarding the participation of Pakistani players in the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) was made even murkier following Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chairman Zaka Ashraf's latest salvo on the matter.

According to a report on popular cricket website ESPNcricinfo, Ashraf indicated that Pakistan players will play in the BPL only if the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) agrees to a tour of Pakistan.

Bangladesh almost toured Pakistan but at the last moment they pulled out over the security concern and I don't want to repeat this again," Ashraf was quoted in the website as saying at the unveiling of the Pakistan Super League in Lahore. "We can't send our players like this, as Bangladesh have an agreement to fulfill. If they decide to come [to] Pakistan and play then we will consider supporting and favoring them [in this matter]," it added.

North in final after big win

To meet Central Zone in day-night affair

Walton Central Zone and BCB North Zone will face off in the final of the inaugural edition of the Bangladesh Cricket

League (BCL). As expected the high-scoring third-round match between Central Zone and Islami Bank East Zone

ended in a draw at the batting paradise of the Shaheed Chandu Stadium in Bogra yesterday. The draw was however good enough for Central Zone to finish top of the table and Saglain Sajib's 10-wicket haul gives

Final will be played after the BPL T20 and before Bangladesh's Sri Lanka

they booked the seat for the final having drawn all three matches.

At the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur, North Zone posted a massive 170-run victory over Prime Bank South Zone on the final day to qualify for the final thanks to a ten-wicket match haul by left-arm spinner Saqlain Sajib.

The final will be held after the completion of the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) T20, which will get underway from January 17. The final match, which will be a daynight affair played with a pink ball, is likely to start from February 22 or February 23 as the Tigers are scheduled to fly for Sri Lanka on March 1 to play two Tests and three ODIs.

Central Zone's Marshal Ayub, the highest run-getter in the last National Cricket League (NCL), scored a double hundred and a hundred to become the top scorer with 454 runs, and like in the NCL, his

Onus on top order

Duronto Rajshahi's strategy at the Bangladesh Premier League's (BPL) players' auction last

month raised many eyebrows. The franchisee surprised many by pitching a bid of 121,000 dollars for young pacer Abul Hasan. It was a figure that surpassed the values of the foreign players in the team. Off the field too, Rajshahi's owner Mushfequr Rahman Mohan consistently hit the headlines.

At first it was a payment-related rift with the national captain Mushfiqur Rahim which was wittily publicised by various media organisations as the 'battle of the Mushfigs'. Then it was his rather curious move to bring Pakistani allrounder Abdul Razzaq to Dhaka in the first week of January, which in his words was a step to prove that the Pakistani players would participate in the second edition of the BPL.

While the Pakistan Cricket Board hasn't yet barred its players from participating in the BPL, it isn't them that Rajshahi should be worried about. Two of their most prominent players, Marlon Samuels and Alex Hales, may not be there for the whole competition. Both players are yet to confirm the exact number of matches that they will be available for.

The most expensive player in the side, Tamim Iqbal, was bought by Rajshahi for 165,000 dollars following a close bidding contest with Dhaka. At the end of the day, it was a coin-toss that sent the hardhitting opener to Rajshahi. With three 60plus scores in his last seven T20 games, Tamim has hit form at the right time. As bad as his experience in the inaugural BPL was, Rajshahi will hope that the lefthander continues his recent good form. Ziaur Rahman has proved time and again that on his day he can tear bowling attacks **SEE PAGE 17 COL 5**

Coaches' deal all but sealed

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) is all set to appoint Dutch coaches Lodewijk de Kruif and Rene Koster, as its head coach of the national team and his deputy-cum-Academy coach today. The two parties, who had had some differences as regards to the terms and conditions of the contracts, have been learnt to have minimised them through talks over the last couple of days. The two coaches will depart for the Netherlands tonight after attending a press conference where they are likely to be officially unveiled as coach. The signing is expected to take place in the morning.

BFF president Kazi Salahuddin said the negotiations were at the latest stage and

the differences they had were being eliminated. "Everything is going in the right direction. I am as hopeful as you all are. There are tiny little things which will be fine-tuned by tonight (Friday). You will know everything in tomorrow's press conference," said Salahuddin after having a brief discussion with the coaches during the Grameenphone Premier League match between Sheikh Russel and Sheikh Jamal yesterday.

Salahuddin could not confirm when the two coaches will be available for the Bangladesh job, but reiterated that the SAFF championship in September is his main target while the AFC Challenge Cup in March will be seen as a trial.

Member of National Teams Committee Tabith M Awal said that the talks they had so far with the coaches centred mostly on SEE PAGE 17 COL 5

Dull draw puts Jamal on top

Former champions Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club played an insipid

goalless draw against new leviathans Sheikh Russel at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday, to take solo lead in the Grameenphone Bangladesh Premier League.

The much-hyped tussle between the two powerhouses failed to live up to the billing and failed to produce any goals both teams took a cautious approach, but it did them no harm as Sheikh Jamal went top with 17 points from seven matches while Sheikh Russel stayed on their heels

with 16 points, tied with defending champions Abahani.

Sheikh Jamal, the lone unbeaten side in the league, preferred the aerial route -fielding Sunday Chizoba and Mike Otojareri -- the two tall Nigerians upfront. However, their attacks were successfully thwarted by Sheikh Russel's backline, which was marshalled by two tall defenders Bojan Petric and Abass Inusah alongside stocky Mamun Mia and Nahidul Islam.

At the other end, Sheikh Russel's dangerous striker Sony Norde was kept under heavy marking by Sheikh Jamal's Guinean defender Mohammad Conte and the striker hardly got space to work throughout the match.
