# Eng draw first blood

India's woeful run of losses continued after a struggling top-order failed to convert good start even on a placid track as England drew first blood with a thrilling nine-run victory in the first onedayer here on Friday.

Chasing a stiff target of 326, India lacked the batting firepower and were restricted to a 316 for nine in a high-scoring contest to concede a 1-0 lead to visitors in the five-match series.

Opting to bat first, England rode on a record 158-run opening stand between captain Alastair Cook (75) and in-form Ian Bell (85) to post an imposing 325 for four on a batting paradise at the newly built Saurashtra Cricket Association Stadium.

The Indians conceded as many as 38 runs in the final two overs with Ishant Sharma and Bhuvneshwar Kumar giving away 20 and 18 runs respectively. The late flourish by England

He also informed that it's not possible to send the team before the BPL, which will start from January 17, as per the demand of their Pakistan counterparts. Papon, who met with Ashraf at New Delhi last week, said that they have a window after the Tigers' tour of Zimbabwe in April.

ESPNcricinfo also added that several Pakistan players were sold at the BPL auction last month but their participation could hinge on the BCB's response to Ashraf's comments. There has been a lot of talk about Bangladesh touring Pakistan but with security continuing to be a concern, there have been no concrete steps forward.

The scheduling of the BPL also clashes with the Quaid e-Azam Trophy, Pakistan's premier first-class tournament, and the PCB said it would not be fair to disrupt the players' commitments to their teams.

The PCB and BCB have been discussing a short Bangladesh tour to Pakistan since 2011, but have faced hurdles throughout. A proposed tour in April 2012 was postponed because of an order from a Dhaka court, and another proposal for a tour in January this year was rejected by the BCB on security grounds. Pakistan have not hosted international cricket since the 2009 terror attacks on the Sri Lanka team bus and have played all their home matches at off-shore venues such as England and the UAE.

Opener Phil Hughes scored a debut century as Australia amassed 305 for five and dismissed Sri Lanka cheaply for a 107run victory in the opening match of the five-game one-day international series on Friday.

Hughes became the first Australian to score a century on his ODI debut as the hosts posted a big score after winning the toss against Sri Lanka in Melbourne.

The diminutive lefthander cracked 112 off 129 balls to help set the Sri Lankans a competitive run chase under lights at 6.12 runs an over.

But the Sri Lankans, failures in the Australian cover fieldsman Glenn AMendis despite being well in the match at 111 for two, selfdestructed with three-run outs and Clint McKay (4-33) helped bowl the tourists out for 198 with 10 overs to spare.

Hughes was the highlight of a free-scoring Australian innings with skipper George Bailey scoring 89 off 79 balls and David Hussey chipping in with a late unbeaten 60 off 34 balls.

Hussey, the younger brother of veteran Mike Hussey, finished with a flourish, plundering 21 runs off the last over from off-spinner Ajantha Mendis, including a six over long-off to bring up his half-century.

STRONG POINT The one thing that Rajshahi has done is that they have signed up a number of 'gamechangers'. In Tamim, Samuels and Abdul Razzaq, they have players who can take away the game from their opponents. Provided that all the players are available, Rajshahi's aggressive top order is their main strength this year. There bowling, on the other hand, may not be as consistent. They'll be depending on Mohammad Sami, Abul Hasan and a string of local youngsters in the side. Taijul Islam and Mukhtar Ali have been drafted in from the Rajshahi division, while leg-spinner Monir Hossain can bring in a bit of variety to the attack.

#### POSSIBLE COMBINATIONS If one goes by last year's strategy, then

Pakistan batsman Shahzaib Hossain might open alongside Tamim. Jahurul Islam, who was bought for 110,000 dollars, will be in contention to open the innings as well. Sean Ervine's good run in the inaugural edition will give him the edge over the other foreign players in the team, whereas Razzaq and Zia will handle the middle order. The equation however will change if and when Samuels and Hales are available. With Razzaq and Zia in the side, Rajshahi have the option of two specialist pacers in Abul and Sami as well as a couple of young spinners.
