Europe now takes US cue

The European Parliament is set to hold a discussion on Wednesday on the working conditions in Bangladesh's garment factories.

The discussion on Bangladesh is part of a three-day plenary session starting today.

Parliamentarians will also talk about health and safety at work, occupational medicine, pay structure, labour rights, trade union and corporate social responsibility in Bangladesh, according to the European Parliament website and the commerce ministry in Dhaka.

The move comes in the wake of the Tazreen fire that killed at least 112 workers, the commerce ministry said in a document, citing a letter from the European Union (EU) sent through the Bangladesh embassy in Brussels.

"We have received a letter from the EU a few days ago and we have already replied to it," Commerce Secretary Mahbub Ahmed told The Daily Star by phone.

In a separate letter, the Bangladesh ambassador urged the commerce ministry to urgently take all necessary measures to prevent any kind of "negative propaganda" SEE PAGE 19 COL 1

KILLING OF 6 STUDENTS

Cops cleared

Charges pressed against 60

The Rapid Action Battalion yesterday pressed charges over the 2011 killing of six students at Aminbazar against 60 people who

do not include any policeman.

"The investigator submitted the charge sheet following a neutral probe and implicated only those found guilty," Rab Director General Mokhlesur Rahman told The Daily Star last night. Police were not involved; they reached the spot after

the killing, he claimed, contradicting the findings of three probe bodies. All the committees, one formed by the High Court and

two by police, found complicity of some cops of Savar Police Station. Eight policemen were even suspended for their

alleged involvement in the killing after the judicial probe body submitted its report on September 8, 2011.

Contacted yesterday, Lt Col Ziaul Ahsan, director of the Rab's intelligence wing, said some policemen had faced demotion for their faults and negligence in duties. But none of them committed a criminal offence.

In the early hours on July 17, 2011, a crime gang killed the youths near the Aminbazar bridge on the capital's outskirts, took the bodies more than half a kilometre away at Keblarchar on the advice of police and called SEE PAGE 19 COL 1


