Vessel capsizes in Ctg port

A lighter vessel with around 1700 tonnes of steel coils capsized at the outer anchorage of Chittagong Port yesterday. The vessel's all the ten crews managed to save their lives

by getting on board a mother vessel anchored beside it. Chittagong Port Authority (CPA) Secretary Syed Farhad Uddin Ahmed said movement of ships through

the port channel was normal. The lighter vessel's master Abdus Sobhan said the

accident occurred when workers of "MV Chisti Shohan" were unloading the steel coils from a Hong Kong flagged mother vessel "IPANEMA" anchored at alpha point of the anchorage around 9:45am.

Some coils suddenly rolled back to the rear portion of the vessel causing it tilted, he said adding that it capsized within 15 minutes.

Mercantile Marine Department (MMD) in Chittagong formed a three-member committee to probe accident. The committee was asked to submit its report within five working days.

Meanwhile, some local boatmen brought an unidentified body from the outer anchorage after the accident, police said.

Potenga Police Station Officer-in-Charge M Alamgir Hossain said they were investigating that whether the dead person appeared to be an outsider died in the accident or not, they said.

A retired army major, who has been serving as traffic and security manager of Bangabandhu Bridge, was suspended yesterday for attacking a truck driver and injuring him critically.

He was also fined Tk 10,000 for treating the injured driver. Police said the ex-major Hasanuzzaman hit driver Atikuzzaman with his wireless set.

Helaluzzaman, OC of Bangabandhu Bridge East Police Station, said a coal-laden truck from Dhaka reached the bridge's east side weight station around 8:00am. The truck was not allow to cross the bridge as it carried some extra weight. When its driver approached to the traffic manager over the issue, Hasanuzzaman hit his head with a wireless set as the driver called him "Chacha" (uncle), said the

Being informed, truck union leaders from Tangail and Sirajganj went to the spot and demanded Hasanuzzaman's punishment.

Hasanuzzaman was employed by a joint venture comprising two Bangladeshi and one Chinese firm to operate the bridge.

Soon after his joining four months ago, he allegedly used to beat up drivers and smashed glasses of trucks. He also misbehaved with journalists, local people and the law enforcers. Despite retiring of his service, he used to wear army dress while on-duty at the bridge.

Murder case filed against male friend

A relative of a Canadian female student, who died after being hit by a train near the capital's Cantonment Railway Station on Saturday night, filed a murder case against a male friend of hers yesterday.

The deceased, as per her passport, is Munjerina Arabin Jerin, 22. The accused Mohiuddin Sharan, a cousin of Jerin's classmate, was arrested by Kamalapur Government Railway Police, with which the case was filed, yesterday.

Jerin visited her aunt in Rampura Saturday morning and left around 4:30pm, said the relative, Prof Afsar Ali.

"She (Jerin) went for a walk with Mohiuddin at the station area behind Hotel

Radisson around 6:30pm. Mohiuddin took her to a nearby hospital after the incident," said Jerin's uncle, Abu Bakar Siddique.

Prof Afsar, quoting witnesses, said Jerin had engaged in a heated argument with Mohiuddin but no one saw what happened right before the impact. He said Mohiuddin gave him a vague

description on how the train hit Jerin.

Born and raised in Canada, Jerin's grades were not good enough for enrollment in a medical school there. Therefore, she came to Bangladesh in 2012 and got enrolled in Uttara Women's Medical College, said Siddique. She was residing in the college's hostel

while her Bangladeshi parents reside in Canada.
