


The nation and the world in Sayeed Ahmed's plays

Renowned playwright recalled

Sayeed Ahmed Foundation for Culture and Art organised a commemorative programme on the occasion of the playwright's birth and death anniversary at Bangladesh Shilpkala Academy (BSA) on January 11. Ahmed was born on January 1, 1931 and died on January 21, 2010. The programme featured a discussion and staging of his play "Kalbela".

At the seminar, Professor Sakhawat Hossain read out a keynote paper titled "Sayeed Ahmed-er Naikot-er Swades O Antorjatikota". The paper focused on the essence of patriotism and internationalism in Ahmed's plays. Theatre personalities Ataur Rahman, Aly Zaker, Nasiruddin Yousuff, Liaquat Ali Lucky (director gen-

eral of BSA) and noted artist Mustafa Monwar took part in the discussion.

The speakers asserted that while Ahmed only wrote five unique plays, he made a great impact on Bangladeshi theatre. His plays were staged in different parts of the world. Ahmed wrote several books on theatre and art. He regularly wrote for a number of leading newspapers and journals. He was closely connected with internationally renowned artists, painters, novelists and playwrights.

Theatre troupe Palakar staged the drama "Kalbela" at the Experimental Theatre Hall of BSA. The play was directed by Aminur Rahman Mukul. At the programme, poet and playwright Syed Shamsul Haq spoke about Ahmed's plays, life and different aspects of his

creativity. Suraiva Begum, secretary, Ministry of Cultural Affairs, was also present.

Ahmed was considered one of pioneering cultural personalities of the country, especially in the field of theatre. Among his most notable plays are "Kalbela" (1962), "Milepost" (1965), "Trishnae" (1968), "Ek Din Protidin" (1974) and "Shesh Nawab" (1988).

His plays have been translated into English, French, German and Italian.

Harmony and beauty in Bangladeshi craft

In conversation with Ruby Ghaznavi

At the National Crafts Council meeting at Bengal Gallery in Dhaka recently, Bengal Gallery director Subir Chowdhury and Bengal Foundation Director General Luva Nahid Chowdhury, as well as Bangladeshi National Crafts Council members Chandra Shekhar Shaha and Ruby Ghaznavi discussed the state of crafts in Bangladesh -- focusing on promotion and development of crafts to reach world standards. They also made the point that the media has an important role to play in popularising crafts.

Ruby Ghaznavi said that the idea behind the establishment of the Crafts Council was to develop crafts like shatranj and banshi. Asserting that crafts are considered frivolous by policymakers -- even though the industry employs

the second largest number of people, right after agriculture, she said there has been a boost for crafts gaining patronage and popularity in recent years through the council's association with Bengal Foundation.

Four craft mediums are selected every year and get focus, and the best craftsmen in the field are awarded certificates and cash prizes, she said, adding that this year's categories are: tepe putul or clay figures -- including animals and conventional dolls; shatranj or woven mat; cane basketry; and woodcraft. The reason behind choosing specific mediums every year is so that the selection is spread over different craftsmen, to honour and acknowledge their work, Ghaznavi added. Four winners get 50,000 taka awards each, along with crests and certificates, while other talented craftspeople

Moreover, Ghaznavi said work-

shops are also given certificates of appreciation.

One of the problems craftsmen face is that many do not participate in the selling, and another factor is that they cannot afford to leave their crafts with crafts authorities for selection.

The Crafts Council doesn't know how to solve this problem. The president of the council is Munira Emdad of Tangu Sari Kutir.

"Some of us buy them off, so that all their products are sold," Ghaznavi said.

According to Ghaznavi, four winners and others are invited to the "Karu Mela" every year, where the items are sold directly to the visitors. The retailers are contacted, and this helps the craftspeople market their products.

The Council prefers to give prizes to craftspeople who

adhere to tradition. Even in modern furniture shops, the carving is done by traditional artisans. The Crafts Council documents the designs and the techniques are recorded. The Council hopes to make this known to the public, in a befitting manner.

The traditional Bororiar Mela was held on January 11 (Poush 28 of the Bengali calendar) at Bororia village under Balidha union in Mohammadpur upazila, located about 30 kms from the district headquarters.

The annual mela that attracts large number of enthusiastic visitors every year fielded a number of traditional events like horse race, lathikheela (mock fight with sticks), Jhapan-khela (snake charmers) during the day and jatrapala (folk opera) at night.

Younis Ali Sardar a college teacher in the area, said that the mela held at Magura is an occasion for the sale and display of products from adjoining districts like Narail, Faridpur as well as far off places like Chittagong.

Former union parishad chairman Abul Kalam Fakir said that the mela has become a much awaited event for locals of all ages.


